A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the project EAST 2 (environmental and spatial technology) initiative started as a 3 pilot program in the Maui district high schools during the 4 summer of 2000, which later moved to Hawaii county and then to a 5 middle school on Kauai. Project EAST holds great potential for assisting Hawaii's public schools in developing important 6 7 critical thinking, problem-solving, and analytical skills in 8 Hawaii's youth that are necessary for them to succeed in high 9 technology-based jobs. Project EAST integrates cutting edge 10 technology, such as computer-assisted drafting, geographic 11 information systems, global positioning systems, as well as 12 computer graphic applications, such as soft image, into the 13 educational curriculum. The goal of this initiative is to 14 prepare students for the information technology age by providing 15 a comprehensive project-based and student-centered learning 16 program where the students are responsible for their own 17 learning.

- 1 Seven Project EAST labs have been established in Hawaii -
- 2 Chiefess Kamakahelei middle school on Kauai; Maui high school,
- 3 Baldwin high school, King Kekaulike high school, Lahainaluna
- 4 high school, and Kihei charter school on Maui; and Kea`au high
- 5 school on Hawaii. Since 2001, Hawaii students have won a number
- 6 of awards at the National EAST Conference, competing
- 7 successfully against approximately two hundred schools in six
- 8 other states.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to maintain
- 10 the project EAST program in existing schools and to expand the
- 11 program to schools statewide.
- 12 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 15 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 16 2008-2009, for a grant-in-aid to the Economic Development
- 17 Alliance of Hawaii, Inc., to maintain its project EAST program
- 18 in existing schools and to expand the program to schools
- 19 statewide; provided that no funds shall be expended unless
- 20 matching funds are provided in the manner specified in section
- 21 302A-1314 (p), Hawaii Revised Statutes.



- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
- 3 of this Act.

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4 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
