# H.B. NO. 1742

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 302B-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding the definition of "disruptive behavior" to
3	read as follows:
4	"§302B-1 Definitions. Whenever used in this chapter,
5	unless the context otherwise requires:
6	"Board" means the board of education.
7	"Charter school" refers to those public schools holding
8	charters to operate as charter schools under this chapter,
9	including start-up and conversion charter schools, and that have
10	the flexibility and independent authority to implement
11	alternative frameworks with regard to curriculum, facilities
12	management, instructional approach, virtual education, length of
13	the school day, week, or year, and personnel management.
14	"Charter school review panel" or "panel" means the panel
15	established pursuant to section 302B-3 with the powers and
16	duties to advise and make recommendations to the board regarding
17	issuance and revocation of charters, detailed implementation
18	plan revisions, and charter school evaluations.
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1	"Con	version charter school" means:
2	(1)	Any existing department school that converts to a
3		charter school and is managed and operated in
4		accordance with section 302B-6;
5	(2)	Any existing department school that converts to a
6		charter school and is managed and operated by a
7		nonprofit organization in accordance with section
8		302B-6; [ <del>or</del> ]
9	(3)	A newly created school, consisting of programs or
10		sections of existing public school populations that
11		are funded and governed independently and may include
12		part of a separate Hawaiian language immersion program
13		using existing public school facilities.
14	"Dep	artment" means the department of education.
15	"Det	ailed implementation plan" means the document that
16	details t	he charter school's purpose, focus, operations,
17	organizat	ion, finances, and accountability, and becomes the
18	basis for	a performance contract between the board and the
19	charter s	chool.
20	<u>"Dis</u>	ruptive behavior" means a student that is disciplined
21	under Tit	le 8, Chapter 19, of the Hawaii Administrative Rules
22	for any c	f the following behaviors:



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1	(1)	Engaging in disorderly conduct that in any manner
2		interferes with an orderly educational process;
3	(2)	Threatening, abusing, or otherwise intimidating or
4		attempting to intimidate a school employee or a pupil;
5	(3)	Wilfully disobeying a school employee; or
6	(4)	Using abusive or profane language directed at a school
7		employee.
8	"Exe	cutive director" means the executive director of the
9	charter s	chool administrative office.
10	"Loc	al school board" means the autonomous governing body of
11	a charter	school that receives the charter and is responsible
12	for the f	inancial and academic viability of the charter school,
13	implement	ation of the charter, and the independent authority to
14	determine	the organization and management of the school, the
15	curriculu	m, virtual education, and compliance with applicable
16	federal a	nd state laws, and that has the power to negotiate
17	supplemen	tal collective bargaining agreements with exclusive
18	represent	atives of their employees.
19	"Non	profit organization" means a private, nonprofit, tax-
20	exempt en	tity that:

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1	(1)	Is recognized as a tax-exempt organization under
2		section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of
3		1986, as amended; and
4	(2)	Is domiciled in this State.
5	"Off	ice" means the charter school administrative office.
6	"Org	anizational viability" means that a charter school:
7	(1)	Has been duly constituted in accordance with its
8		charter;
9	(2)	Has a local school board established in accordance
10		with law and the charter school's charter;
11	(3)	Employs sufficient faculty and staff to provide the
12		necessary educational program and support services to
13		operate the facility in accordance with its charter;
14	(4)	Maintains accurate and comprehensive records regarding
15		students and employees as determined by the office;
16	(5)	Meets appropriate standards of student achievement;
17	(6)	Cooperates with board, panel, and office requirements
18		in conducting its functions;
19	(7)	Complies with applicable federal, state, and county
20		laws and requirements;
21	(8)	In accordance with office guidelines and procedures,
22		is financially sound and fiscally responsible in its



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1		use of public funds, maintains accurate and
2		comprehensive financial records, operates in
3		accordance with generally accepted accounting
4		practices, and maintains a sound financial plan;
5	(9)	Operates within the scope of its charter and fulfills
6		obligations and commitments of its charter;
7	(10)	Complies with all health and safety laws and
8		requirements; and
9	(11)	Complies with all board directives, policies, and
10		procedures.
11	"Sta	rt-up charter school" means a new school established
12	under sec	tion 302B-5."
13	SECT	ION 2. Section 302B-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended t	o read as follows:
15	"§30	2B-4 Limits on charter schools. Beginning July 2007,
16	the board	, with the recommendation of the panel, may authorize
17	one new s	tart-up charter school for each existing start-up
18	charter s	chool that has received a three-year or longer
19	accredita	tion from the Western Association of Schools and
20	Colleges	or a comparable accreditation authority as determined
21	by the pa	nel, or for each start-up charter school whose charter
22	is revoke	d. The total number of conversion charter schools
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1	authorized by the board, with the recommendation of the panel,
2	shall not exceed twenty-five, provided that charter schools
3	established for the express purpose of providing an alternative
4	educational setting for students that exhibit disruptive
5	behavior shall not be counted towards the total number of start-
6	up or conversion charter schools allowed under this section."
7	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
