A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRUG ABUSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that crystal			
2	methamphetamine addiction is a major contributor to crime in our			
3	state and adversely affects many other aspects of our society.			
4	In many cases, addicts commit crimes to support their			
5	addictions. The healing of or cure for the addiction is vital			
6	to the overall well-being of Hawaii's people.			
7	The legislature also finds that the PROMETA treatment			
8	protocol may help curtail the often violent withdrawal cravings			
9	of crystal methamphetamine addicts. Introduced in 2003, PROMETA			
10	is an integrated, physician-based treatment protocol for			
11	alcohol, cocaine, and methamphetamine dependence that uses a			
12	combination of prescription medications and nutritional			
13	supplements administered in a proprietary manner, and therapy.			
14	The PROMETA treatment protocol consists of four steps:			
15	(1) A comprehensive medical exam, including urine and			
16	blood tests;			
17	(2) Administration of oral and intravenous medications and			

nutritional supplements over three consecutive days;

1	(3) A second physician-supervised treatment of two visits		
2	on consecutive days, about three weeks after the		
3	initial treatment; and		
4	(4) One month of prescription medications and nutritional		
5	supplements, coupled with individualized after-care.		
6	Treatment takes place at a hospital facility, a treatment		
7	center, or a physician practice that has licensed the rights to		
8	use PROMETA, and does not require long periods away from home or		
9	work.		
10	Although the medications administered under PROMETA are		
11	approved by the Food and Drug Administration, their combined		
12	application in treatment of alcohol, cocaine, and		
13	methamphetamine dependence have not yet been established.		
14	Clinical studies are being conducted.		
15	It is imperative that our State take immediate action to		
16	control an addiction that has grown to epidemic proportions.		
17	The PROMETA method of treatment is promising, and pilot studies		
18	are already in progress in Arizona, Georgia, and South Carolina.		
19	The purpose of this Act is to establish and appropriate		
20	funds for:		

(1) A review of pilot studies being conducted in other

1		address the withdrawal cravings of crystal		
2		methamphetamine addicts; and		
3	(2)	A plan to adopt the PROMETA treatment protocol, if the		
4		review is favorable, as an alternative drug abuse		
5		treatment program for persons convicted of substance		
6		abuse or related offenses.		
7	SECT	ION 2. (a) The department of health and chairs of the		
8	health committees of the senate and house of representatives			
9	shall con	duct a review of the pilot studies being conducted in		
10	other states on use of the PROMETA treatment protocol to address			
11	the withdrawal cravings of crystal methamphetamine addicts. The			
12	review shall:			
13	(1)	Consider at least three pilot studies and their		
14		results; and		
15	(2)	Determine whether the PROMETA treatment protocol is		
16		successful in that it provides at least a thirty per		
17		cent reduction in recidivism rates for crystal		
18		methamphetamine users in the twelve months following		
19		treatment.		
20	(b)	If the review is favorable, the State shall develop a		
21	plan to a	dopt the PROMETA treatment protocol as an alternative		
22	drug abus	e treatment program for persons convicted of substance

- 1 abuse or related offenses. The plan shall include a process by
- 2 which the prosecuting attorneys of each county screen and
- 3 identify individuals to undergo the PROMETA treatment; provided
- 4 that participation in the PROMETA treatment shall be on a
- 5 strictly voluntary basis; provided further that participants
- 6 shall indemnify the State of any adverse effects.
- 7 (c) The department of health shall submit to the
- 8 legislature a report of its findings and recommendations,
- 9 including any proposed legislation, no later than twenty days
- 10 prior to the convening of the regular session of 2008.
- 11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for a
- 14 review of the pilot studies being conducted in other states on
- 15 use of the PROMETA treatment protocol to address the withdrawal
- 16 cravings of crystal methamphetamine addicts.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 18 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to develop
- 22 a plan to adopt the PROMETA treatment protocol as an alternative

- 1 drug abuse treatment program for persons convicted of substance
- 2 abuse or related offenses; provided that:
- 3 (1) The report from the department of health is favorable;
- 4 and
- 5 (2) The department of health shall conduct price
- 6 negotiations for use of the PROMETA treatment
- 7 protocol.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
