A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. A sustainable economy is most effectively
achieved through an educated workforce. This education includes
the short-term training of small business owners and managers
who create new jobs and generate greater tax revenues for the
state. These increased tax revenues support the social, health,
and educational programs of the government.

7 The Hawaii Small Business Development Center Network has 8 promoted a healthy and sustainable economy by providing 9 consulting and training, including management-force training 10 since 1990, to existing small businesses and new ventures across 11 the state. It is the only accredited business assistance 12 organization in Hawaii and the only such organization that conducts third-party annual economic impact studies of its 13 14 outcomes. Management-force training promotes improvements in 15 the conditions under which small businesses thrive and promotes 16 sustainable economic development.

17 The Hawaii Small Business Development Center Network is 18 also part of a matching-funds program partially funded by the HB180 HD1 HMS 2007-2041

United States Small Business Administration; the University of
Hawaii at Hilo; and a consortium of other federal, state, and
private-sector sponsors and partners.

4 This investment in human capital will lead to real, 5 sustained growth and high productivity. Funding this Act would generate an annual economic impact of approximately \$29,000,000. 6 7 This projection is based on an independent economic impact study completed in 2004, The Annual Economic Impact of the Hawaii 8 9 Small Business Development Center. According to the study, for 10 every dollar invested by the State, \$4.45 was returned to the 11 State in the first year in new incremental taxes from job 12 creation, retention of existing jobs, and sales increases.

13 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate moneys to the 14 Hawaii Small Business Development Center Network to further its 15 mission of providing assistance to small businesses through 16 management-force training.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to create sustainable economic development through consulting and training services at the Hawaii Small Business Development Center Network as follows:
