

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) The legislature finds and declares that:
2	(1)	Fishing in Hawaii is a tradition woven into our island
3		communities and local cultures that have been passed
4		down for generations;
5	(2)	Fishery resources need to be adequately monitored and
6		managed based on sound science;
7	(3)	Communities that rely on Hawaii's ocean resources are
8		disenfranchised with the current administrative rule-
9		making process used to develop fishery management
10		policies;
11	(4)	The current rule-making process has not required the
12		department of land and natural resources to
13		demonstrate a scientific need prior to establishing
14		new prohibitions or limitations on fishing in public
15		fishing areas and to fully engage impacted communities
16		and user groups early in the policy development phase;
17		and

	(5)	A clear policy is required that ensures that a
		documented transparent process is used that utilizes
		peer-reviewed science and empirical Hawaiian science,
		and allows for public participation and input in
		policy development throughout the board of land and
		natural resources policy making process, especially
		prior to any board of land and natural resources rule
		adopting action.

- (b) The purposes of this Act are to:
- (1) Require the department of land and natural resources to demonstrate a scientific need for and to fully engage impacted communities and user groups early in the policy-making phase prior to establishing new prohibitions or limitations on fishing in public fishing areas;
 - (2) Establish a fishery policy advisory task force to review the current department of land and natural resources rule-making process and develop recommendations for changes and improvements; and
- (3) Make an appropriation for operations of the fishery policy advisory task force.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 190, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is								
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated								
3	and to read as follows:								
4	"§190- Fishing prohibition or limitation; based on								
5	scientific information; closed area regulation. No fishing rule								
6	that becomes effective and implemented after January 1, 2007,								
7	shall prohibit or limit fishing for aquatic life, as those terms								
8	are defined in section 187A-1, in any areas open to public								
9	fishing:								
10	(1) Unless the proposed fishing prohibition or limitation:								
11	(A) Has been developed through a community-based								
12	ahupuaa, moku, or community-based subsistence								
13	management program previously established;								
14	(B) Has had a thorough review and analysis of								
15	available peer-reviewed, scientific information,								
16	including traditional Hawaiian and local fishers								
17	knowledge that clearly demonstrates a correlation								
18	between existing fishing practices and a specific								
19	<pre>conservation problem;</pre>								
20	(C) Has considered other conservation measures,								
21	including but not limited to sizing, seasonal								

1		clos	ure periods, bag limits, equipment
2		limi	tations; and
3		(D) Has	determined that enforcement of existing
4		regu	lations will not adequately provide for
5		cons	ervation and management of the affected
6		stoc	ks of targeted fish; and
7	(2)	If it pro	vides for any closed area regulation, shall:
8		(A) Incl	ude specific measurable criteria to determine
9		the	conservation benefit of the closed area on
10		the	affected stocks of fish, including:
11		<u>(i)</u>	The identification of specific species to be
12			protected, including current stock
13			assessment, where available, of the species
14			as they occur throughout their range;
15		<u>(ii)</u>	The historic and current fishing effort,
16			including numbers of fishers, hooks, and
17			soak time on the targeted species;
18		<u>(iii)</u>	The historic and current extraction rate,
19			including data on fish caught and released
20			or damaged, of targeted species;
21		<u>(iv)</u>	Other environmental and nonfishing use
22			factors that may be contributing to the

1			current condition of the targeted species,		
2			where available; and		
3		<u>(v)</u>	A scheduled review of the continued need for		
4			the closed area is at least once every three		
5			years, with a report to the legislature and		
6			<pre>public;</pre>		
7	<u>(B)</u>	Cove	r an area that is no larger than can be		
8		supp	orted by the best available peer-reviewed		
9		scie	ntific, traditional Hawaiian and local		
10		fish	ers information; and		
11	(C)	Cont	ain a sunset provision to automatically end		
12		the	closed area; provided that the closed area		
13		rest	riction may be reimposed after twelve months,		
14		<u>in a</u>	ccordance with the requirements of this		
15		sect	ion."		
16	SECTION 3	. (a) There is established the Hawaii fishery		
17	policy advisor	y tas	k force to identify and recommend to the		
18	legislature revisions to the current Hawaii administrative				
19	rules, title 13 (department of land and natural resources),				
20	subtitle 4, fisheries regulations, that utilizes the best				
21	available peer-reviewed science and ensures public participation				

- 1 and input on all proposed rules or amendments to existing rules
- 2 prior to adoption by the board of land and natural resources.
- 3 (b) The task force shall consist of thirteen members:
- 4 (1) Two members to be designated by the Alii Holokai Dive
- 5 Club;
- **6** (2) Two members to be designated by Pacific Islands
- 7 Fisheries Group;
- 8 (3) Two members to be designated by the Association of
- 9 Hawaiian Civic Club's Ocean Resources Committee;
- 10 (4) One member to be designated by the Northwestern
- 11 Hawaiian Islands Bottomfish Hui;
- 12 (5) One member to be designated by the Kewalo Keiki
- 13 Fishing Conservancy; and
- 14 five members to be appointed by the governor, without regard to
- 15 section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 16 The task force shall select a chairperson from among its
- 17 members. The number of members necessary to constitute a quorum
- 18 to do business shall consist of a majority of all members of the
- 19 task force. When a quorum is in attendance, the concurrence of
- 20 a majority of the members in attendance shall make any action of
- 21 the task force valid.

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- 1 The task force may request assistance from the department of land and natural resources, attorney general, and other 2 appropriate state agencies in fulfilling the purpose of the task 3 force. The task force may also request assistance from federal fishery agencies and organizations, the public and other states. 5 6 The members shall not receive compensation for their services but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including travel 7 expenses, incurred in the performance of their duties under this 8 9 part. The taskforce shall: 10 11 Review the current department of land and natural (1)12 resources rule-making process regarding fisheries; 13 (2) Report its findings and recommendations, including 14 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than 15 twenty days prior to the regular session of 2008. 16 recommendations shall contain a detailed rationale for 17 implementation; and Cease to exist on June 30, 2008. 18 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so much 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for the 21 22 fishery policy advisory task force to carry out its
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- 1 responsibilities, including the contracting for consultant
- 2 services and studies.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall not supersede or affect any
- 6 rules in effect on December 31, 2006, or any designated
- 7 community based subsistence fishing area established pursuant to
- 8 section 188-22.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 9 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007;
- 11 provided that section 2 of this Act shall take effect upon its
- 12 approval and shall be applied retroactively to January 1, 2007.
