A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GASOLINE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The	e legislature finds that while ethanol,	which
2	is currently being used as an additive to gasoline to reduce		
3	pollution and displace petroleum, is a good cleaner and solvent		
4	when used at fairly	high concentrations, it causes two prob	olems:
5	(1) The ethanol in ethanol-blended gasoline absorbs		
6	moisture from the humidity in the air, causing the		ne
7	gasoline and ethanol to separate. Once separated,		ī,
8	neither parts are a suitable fuel and are not easily		
9	miscible	without the proper equipment.	
10	(2) Ethanol re	eacts with rubber and fiberglass and wou	ıld
11	dissolve parts made of rubber or fiberglass upon		
12	prolonged	contact.	
13	While the automobile industry discontinued use of rubber		
14	for its seals and hoses, as the use of ethanol was		
15	popularized, other industries, such as boat and lawnmower		
16	manufacturers, continued to use rubber and fiberglass for		
17	components of its fuel tanks and have only recently		
18	switched to materials that are ethanol-safe. Rubber and		



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- 1 fiberglass parts of older automobiles, boats, and
- 2 lawnmowers are now at risk of dissolving. This problem is
- 3 exacerbated by the tendency of ethanol to absorb water and
- 4 separate into gasoline and ethanol.
- 5 The legislature finds that the use of a high percentage of
- 6 ethanol as an additive in gasoline will cause many problems for
- 7 owners of older model automobiles, boats, and lawnmowers. The
- 8 legislature believes that using a lower ethanol content in
- 9 gasoline will prevent these problems.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to reduce the percentage of
- 11 ethanol content required in gasoline sold in the state for use
- 12 in motor vehicles from ten per cent to two per cent.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 486J-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- 15 "(a) The director shall adopt rules in accordance with
- 16 chapter 91 to require that gasoline sold in the State for use in
- 17 motor vehicles contain [ten] two per cent ethanol by volume.
- 18 The amounts of gasoline sold in the State containing [ten] two
- 19 per cent ethanol shall be in accordance with rules as the
- 20 director may deem appropriate. The director may authorize the
- 21 sale of gasoline that does not meet these requirements as
- 22 provided in subsection (d).



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- 1 (b) Gasoline blended with an ethanol-based product, such
- 2 as ethyl tertiary butyl ether, shall be considered to be in
- 3 conformance with this section if the quantity of ethanol used in
- 4 the manufacture of the ethanol-based product represents [ten]
- 5 two per cent, by volume, of the finished motor fuel."
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Changes the ethanol content requirement for gasoline sold in the state for use in motor vehicles from 10% to 2%.
