A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Findings and purpose. The legislature finds
2	that with in-migration and the aging of our population, among
3	other things, the demographics of the State are evolving. Over
4	the past twenty-five years, the statewide population has
5	increasingly shifted from the urban core to the suburbs,
6	especially on Oahu, where the population center has steadily
7	moved to the western side of the island. Meanwhile, some of the
8	areas in the state with the fastest-growing populations are
9	Kihei, Maui, and west Hawaii. These demographic shifts have
10	overburdened public school facilities in growing areas and left
11	some public school facilities in other areas underutilized.
12	Thus, the legislature believes there is a need to revitalize
13	school facilities statewide, including building or expanding
14	schools in certain areas and consolidating or closing schools in
15	other areas.
16	However, the legislature finds that despite broad-based

public recognition of Hawaii's changing demographics, there is

often little public support for changes that affect specific

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- 1 constituencies. In particular, this is true of proposals to
- 2 close or consolidate public schools to maximize resources.
- 3 The legislature recognizes the difficulties, political and
- 4 otherwise, inherent in these decisions. But in the face of
- 5 increasing educational priorities, the legislature believes that
- 6 just as the construction or expansion of some schools is
- 7 important, the consolidation or closure of other schools is also
- 8 necessary. It is important that any actions to do so be taken
- 9 through a very objective and transparent process that benefits
- 10 the greatest number of public school students and their
- 11 families.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to revitalize school facilities
- 13 statewide and to more effectively and efficiently use our
- 14 taxpayers' investment in public education. Specifically, this
- 15 Act provides for the timely construction, expansion,
- 16 consolidation, or closure of public schools in Hawaii through an
- 17 objective and transparent process that, at a minimum:
- 18 (1) Includes the establishment of a facilities alignment
- 19 commission that shall:
- 20 (A) Establish criteria for the selection of public
- schools to be constructed, expanded,
- consolidated, or closed; and



1		(B) Recommend, based upon these criteria, a list of
2		areas for new school construction, and of schools
3		for expansion, consolidation, or closure, which
4		is subject to the review of the legislature; and
5	(2)	Directs the board of education to proceed with the
6		process of constructing, expanding, consolidating, or
7		closing schools according to the recommendations of
8		the facilities alignment commission.
9	SECT	ION 2. Facilities alignment commission. (a) There is
10	establish	ed the facilities alignment commission, to be attached
11	to the de	partment of education for administrative purposes. The
12	commissio	n shall be composed of nine members appointed by the
13	governor;	provided that:
14	(1)	Three members shall be appointed from a list of
15		nominees submitted by the president of the senate; and
16	(2)	Three members shall be appointed from a list of
17		nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of
18		representatives.
19	(b)	The chairperson of the commission shall be selected by
20	the membe	rs of the commission.

(c) Members of the commission shall not be employees of

the State.

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- 1 (d) Any substantive action taken by the commission
- 2 pursuant to sections 4 through 6 of this Act shall be approved
- 3 by a two-thirds vote of its members. For all other actions of
- 4 the commission, five members shall constitute a quorum to do
- 5 business, of which a majority vote shall suffice.
- 6 (e) The commission shall be exempt from chapter 91, Hawaii
- 7 Revised Statutes, but shall be subject to chapters 92 and 92F,
- 8 Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 9 (f) The members of the commission shall serve without
- 10 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses necessary for
- 11 the performance of their duties, including travel expenses.
- 12 (g) The department of education shall provide
- 13 administrative support to the commission. The commission shall
- 14 have access to all records in the department of education and
- 15 department of accounting and general services pertinent to its
- 16 duties and may request research and analysis assistance from the
- 17 department of education. Pursuant to chapter 92F, Hawaii
- 18 Revised Statutes, the commission shall maintain the
- 19 confidentiality of all confidential information.
- 20 (h) The commission shall terminate upon adjournment of the
- 21 regular legislative session of 2009, sine die.

1	SECT	ION 3. Procedures for making recommendations for
2	school al	ignment; school facilities plan. (a) The department
3	of educat	ion shall submit to the commission by August 31, 2007
4	a thirty-	year school facilities plan for the department of
5	education	. The school facilities plan shall be based on the
6	departmen	t's assessment of the projected student enrollment for
7	every pub	lic school in the state, except for charter schools.
8	In conduc	ting the assessment, the department shall:
9	(1)	Consider the six-year program and financial plan
10		prepared pursuant to section 37-69, Hawaii Revised
11		Statutes, to the extent it is applicable;
12	(2)	Develop and consider a thirty-year projection of the
13		enrollment at each school across the State and the
14		resulting need for facilities; and
15	(3)	Consider other reliable data relative to population
16		growth and trends, and anticipated levels of funding
17		necessary for every school.
18	(b)	The school facilities plan shall include:
19	(1)	A description of the assessment of projected student
20		enrollment pursuant to subsection (a);
21	(2)	A comprehensive inventory of all department of
22		education facilities;

1	(3)	For each school district, thirty-year projections for
2		the numbers and locations of schools required annually
3		to accommodate the numbers and types of students in
4		the projected enrollment; and
5-	(4)	Recommendations for the construction, expansion,
6		consolidation, or closure of schools based on the
7		projections and assessment made pursuant to this
8		section.
9	SECT	ION 4. School alignment selection criteria. (a) By
10	December	31, 2007, the commission shall establish the criteria
11	that will	be used by the commission to select:
12	(1)	Areas for new school construction;
13	(2)	Schools for expansion, except charter schools;
14	(3)	Schools to be consolidated, except charter schools;
15		and
16	(4)	Schools to be closed, except charter schools.
17	(b)	The criteria shall require, at a minimum, the
18	considera	tion of:
19	(1)	The overutilization or underutilization of school
20		facilities;
21	(2)	The impact of the consolidation or closure of a school
22		on the community in which it is located; and

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         (3) The costs or savings resulting from the continued
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              operation, consolidation, or closure of a school,
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              including the costs of deferred and future repair and
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              maintenance.
         (c) Before finalizing the school alignment selection
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    criteria, the commission shall hold public hearings to obtain
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    public response to the commission's proposed criteria. For each
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    public hearing, the commission shall provide appropriate notice,
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    as defined in section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, both
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    statewide and county-wide in each county of the State. The
    commission shall make available to the public draft copies of
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    its proposed criteria not less than two weeks prior to the start
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    of the public hearings.
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         SECTION 5. Preliminary recommendations.
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    29, 2008, based on the school facilities plan developed pursuant
    to section 3 and the final school alignment selection criteria
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    adopted pursuant to section 4, the commission shall compile a
    preliminary list of recommended:
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         (1) Areas for new school construction;
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         (2)
              Schools for expansion, except charter schools;

- 2 (b) The list of recommendations shall include a summary of
- 3 the selection process that resulted in the recommendation of
- 4 each area or school on the list, including a justification for
- 5 each recommendation.
- 6 (c) In selecting areas and schools for the list, the
- 7 commission shall consider equally all schools within the state,
- 8 without regard to whether the board of education had previously
- 9 considered the school for consolidation or closure.
- 10 SECTION 6. Public hearings and final recommendations by
- 11 the commission. (a) By September 1, 2008, the commission shall
- 12 hold public hearings to obtain public response to the
- 13 commission's preliminary recommendations. For each public
- 14 hearing, the commission shall provide appropriate notice as
- 15 defined in section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, both
- 16 statewide and county-wide in each county of the State. The
- 17 commission shall make available to the public draft copies of
- 18 the preliminary recommendations not less than two weeks prior to
- 19 the start of the public hearings.
- 20 (b) Not less than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 21 the regular session of 2009, the commission shall submit to the

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    legislature a report of its findings and conclusions, including
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    a final list of recommendations for:
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         (1)
              Areas for new school construction;

              Schools for expansion, except charter schools;
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         (3)
              Schools to be consolidated, except charter schools;
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              and

              Schools to be closed, except charter schools.
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              The final list of recommendations shall be subject to
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    legislative disapproval only in their entirety, by concurrent
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    resolution.
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              If the legislature does not disapprove the
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    recommendations pursuant to subsection (c), then after the
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    adjournment of the regular legislative session of 2009, sine
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    die, the board of education shall begin compliance with the
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    recommendations of the commission for the 2010-2011 school year
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    to:
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         (1) Construct new schools;
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         (2) Expand schools; and
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         (3) Consolidate or close schools.
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         SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
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    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $

Report Title:

School Facilities; Facilities Alignment Commission

Description:

Creates the facilities alignment commission to establish criteria for the selection of public schools to be constructed, expanded, consolidated, or closed, and recommend, based upon these criteria, a list of areas for new school construction, and of schools for expansion, consolidation, or closure. Allows the legislature to disapprove these recommendations only in their entirety. If no legislative disapproval occurs, requires the board of education to comply with these recommendations. (HB19 HD1)
