A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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1	SECTION 1. Findings and purpose. The legislature finds		
2	that with in-migration and the aging of our population, among		
3	other things, the demographics of the State are evolving. Over		
4	the past twenty-five years, the statewide population has		
5	increasingly shifted from the urban core to the suburbs,		
6	especially on Oahu, where the population center has steadily		
7	moved to the western side of the island. Meanwhile, some of the		
8	areas in the state with the fastest-growing populations are		
9	Kihei, Maui, and west Hawaii. These demographic shifts have		
10	overburdened public school facilities in growing areas and left		
11	some public school facilities in other areas underutilized.		
12	Thus, the legislature believes there is a need to revitalize		
13	school facilities statewide, including building or expanding		
14	schools in certain areas and consolidating or closing schools in		
15	other areas.		
16	However, the legislature finds that despite broad-based		

public recognition of Hawaii's changing demographics, there is often little public support for changes that affect specific HB19 HD2 HMS 2007-2557

1 constituencies. In particular, this is true of proposals to 2 close or consolidate public schools to maximize resources. 3 The legislature recognizes the difficulties, political and 4 otherwise, inherent in these decisions. But in the face of 5 increasing educational priorities, the legislature believes that 6 just as the construction or expansion of some schools is 7 important, the consolidation or closure of other schools is also 8 necessary. It is important that any actions construct, expand, 9 consolidate, or close schools be accomplished through a very 10 objective and transparent process that benefits the greatest 11 number of public school students and their families. 12 The purpose of this Act is to revitalize school facilities 13 statewide and to more effectively and efficiently use our 14 taxpayers' investment in public education. Specifically, this 15 Act provides for the timely construction, expansion, 16 consolidation, or closure of public schools in Hawaii through an 17 objective and transparent process that, at a minimum: 18 (1)Includes the establishment of a facilities alignment 19 commission that shall: 20 (A) Establish criteria for the selection of public 21 schools to be constructed, expanded,

consolidated, or closed; and



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1		(B) Recommend, based upon these criteria, a list of
2		areas for new school construction, and of schools
3		for expansion, consolidation, or closure, subject
4		to the review of the legislature;
5		and
6	(2)	Directs the board of education to proceed with the
7		process of constructing, expanding, consolidating, or
8		closing schools according to the recommendations of
9		the facilities alignment commission.
10	SECT	ION 2. Facilities alignment commission. (a) There is
11	establish	ed the facilities alignment commission, to be attached
12	to the de	partment of education for administrative purposes. The
13	commissio	n shall be composed of nine members appointed by the
14	governor;	provided that:
15	(1)	Three members shall be appointed from a list of
16		nominees submitted by the president of the senate; and
17	(2)	Three members shall be appointed from a list of
18		nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of
19		representatives.
20	(b)	The chairperson of the commission shall be selected by
21	the membe	rs of the commission.

- 1 (c) Members of the commission shall not be employees of
- 2 the State.
- 3 (d) Any substantive action taken by the commission
- 4 pursuant to sections 4 through 6 of this Act shall be approved
- 5 by a two-thirds vote of its members. For all other actions of
- 6 the commission, five members shall constitute a quorum to do
- 7 business, of which a majority vote shall suffice to approve such
- 8 actions.
- 9 (e) The commission shall be exempt from chapter 91, Hawaii
- 10 Revised Statutes, but shall be subject to chapters 92 and 92F,
- 11 Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 12 (f) The members of the commission shall serve without
- 13 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses necessary for
- 14 the performance of their duties, including travel expenses.
- 15 (g) The department of education shall provide
- 16 administrative support to the commission. The commission shall
- 17 have access to all records in the department of education and
- 18 department of accounting and general services pertinent to its
- 19 duties and may request research and analysis assistance from the
- 20 department of education. Pursuant to chapter 92F, Hawaii
- 21 Revised Statutes, the commission shall maintain the
- 22 confidentiality of all confidential information.

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- (h) The commission shall terminate upon adjournment of the
 regular legislative session of 2009, sine die.
- 3 SECTION 3. Procedures for making recommendations for
- 4 school alignment; school facilities plan. (a) The department
- 5 of education shall submit to the facilities alignment commission
- 6 by August 31, 2007, a thirty-year school facilities plan for the
- 7 department of education. The school facilities plan shall be
- 8 based on the department's assessment of the projected student
- 9 enrollment for every public school in the state, except for
- 10 charter schools. In conducting the assessment, the department
- 11 shall:
- 12 (1) Consider the six-year program and financial plan
- prepared pursuant to section 37-69, Hawaii Revised
- 14 Statutes, to the extent it is applicable;
- 15 (2) Develop and consider a thirty-year projection of the
- 16 enrollment at each school across the state and the
- 17 resulting need for facilities; and
- 18 (3) Consider other reliable data relative to population
- 19 growth and trends, and anticipated levels of funding
- necessary for every school.
- 21 (b) The school facilities plan shall include:

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             A description of the assessment of projected student

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              enrollment pursuant to subsection (a);
             A comprehensive inventory of all department of

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         (3) For each school district, thirty-year projections for
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              the numbers and locations of schools required annually

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         (4) Recommendations for the construction, expansion,

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              projections and assessment made pursuant to this
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              section.
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         SECTION 4. School alignment selection criteria. (a) By
    December 31, 2007, the facilities alignment commission shall
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    establish the criteria that will be used by the commission to
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    select:
         (1) Areas for new school construction;
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         (2) Schools for expansion, except charter schools;
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         (3) Schools to be consolidated, except charter schools;
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              and
              Schools to be closed, except charter schools.

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1 The criteria shall require, at a minimum, the 2 consideration of: The overutilization or underutilization of school 3 (1)facilities; The impact of the consolidation or closure of a school 5 (2)on the community in which it is located; and 6 7 The costs or savings resulting from the continued (3) 8 operation, consolidation, or closure of a school, 9 including the costs of deferred and future repair and 10 maintenance. 11 (c) Before finalizing the school alignment selection criteria, the commission shall hold public hearings to obtain 12 public response to the commission's proposed criteria. For each 13 public hearing, the commission shall provide appropriate notice, 14 as required by section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, both 15 16 statewide and county-wide in each county of the State. The 17 commission shall make available to the public draft copies of its proposed criteria not less than two weeks prior to the start 18 19 of the public hearings. 20 SECTION 5. Preliminary recommendations. (a) By February 29, 2008, based on the school facilities plan developed pursuant 21

to section 3 and the final school alignment selection criteria

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- 1 adopted pursuant to section 4, the facilities alignment
- 2 commission shall compile a preliminary list of recommended:
- 3 (1) Areas for new school construction;
- 4 (2) Schools for expansion, except charter schools;
- 5 (3) Schools to be consolidated, except charter schools;
- 6 and
- 7 (4) Schools to be closed, except charter schools.
- 8 (b) The list of recommendations shall include a summary of
- 9 the selection process that resulted in the recommendation of
- 10 each area or school on the list, including a justification for
- 11 each recommendation.
- 12 (c) In selecting areas and schools for the list, the
- 13 commission shall consider equally all schools within the state,
- 14 without regard to whether the board of education had previously
- 15 considered the school for consolidation or closure.
- 16 SECTION 6. Public hearings and final recommendations by
- 17 the commission. (a) By September 1, 2008, the facilities
- 18 alignment commission shall hold public hearings to obtain public
- 19 response to the commission's preliminary recommendations. For
- 20 each public hearing, the commission shall provide appropriate
- 21 notice as required by section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 22 both statewide and county-wide in each county of the State. The

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- 1 commission shall make available to the public draft copies of
- 2 the preliminary recommendations not less than two weeks prior to
- 3 the start of the public hearings.
- 4 (b) Not less than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 5 the regular session of 2009, the commission shall submit to the
- 6 legislature a report of its findings and conclusions, including
- 7 a final list of recommendations for:
- **8** (1) Areas for new school construction;
- 9 (2) Schools for expansion, except charter schools;
- 10 (3) Schools to be consolidated, except charter schools;
- 11 and
- 12 (4) Schools to be closed, except charter schools.
- 13 (c) The final list of recommendations shall be subject to
- 14 legislative disapproval only in their entirety, by concurrent
- 15 resolution.
- 16 (d) If the legislature does not disapprove the
- 17 recommendations pursuant to subsection (c), then after the
- 18 adjournment of the regular legislative session of 2009, sine
- 19 die, the board of education shall begin compliance with the
- 20 recommendations of the commission for the 2010-2011 school year
- 21 to:
- 22 (1) Construct new schools;

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- 1 (2) Expand schools; and
- 2 (3) Consolidate or close schools.
- 3 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for
- 6 expenses incurred by the facilities alignment commission in
- 7 carrying out its duties.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Report Title:

School Facilities; Facilities Alignment Commission

Description:

Creates the facilities alignment commission to establish criteria for the selection of public schools to be constructed, expanded, consolidated, or closed, and recommend, based upon these criteria, a list of areas for new school construction, and of schools for expansion, consolidation, or closure. Allows the legislature to disapprove these recommendations only in their entirety. If no legislative disapproval occurs, requires the board of education to comply with these recommendations.
