A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state's rapidly
- 2 aging population will significantly increase the demand for
- 3 health care services and long-term care. Regrettably, there is
- 4 a growing shortage of health care professionals in Hawaii,
- 5 especially on the neighbor islands and in rural areas. The
- 6 problem is further aggravated by the fact that as we lose
- 7 essential health care providers, our current health care
- 8 workforce continues to age, exacerbating the growing shortage of
- 9 providers. Low reimbursement rates, issues related to living
- 10 and working in remote communities, challenging working
- 11 conditions, and the cost of medical malpractice insurance also
- 12 continue to create barriers to recruitment and retention of
- 13 health care providers, especially in certain specialty areas.
- 14 While we struggle to provide adequate health insurance for
- 15 all of Hawaii's citizens, the health care workforce shortage
- 16 will continue to leave many without access to appropriate care.
- 17 A fully staffed, well-trained health care workforce is a key



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- component in providing quality health care to all Hawaii
 residents.
- The purpose of this Act is to develop and maintain a securestatewide comprehensive health care workforce map and database.
- 5 The department of health shall:
- 6 (1) Compile and analyze existing data on the supply and 7 distribution of all health care practitioners, 8 technicians, and other health care workers by 9 specialty and practice location;
- 10 (2) Develop a plan to collect and systematically update11 data;
- 12 (3) Develop a plan to project and meet future health care13 workforce needs;
- (4) Develop a plan to address and reduce any identifiedshortages of health care workers; and
- 16 (5) Ensure that data collected is accurate and secure and
 17 that data specific to any practitioner is disclosed
 18 only with the express written consent of the
 19 practitioner.
- 20 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the

- 1 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 2 2008-2009 for the department of health to develop and maintain a
- 3 statewide comprehensive health care workforce map and database.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
