## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING TOURISM.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that hunting tourism in
2	general and private and commercial shooting preserves in
3	particular are viable yet underdeveloped. The legislature
4	further finds that promoting hunting tourism permits
5	diversification of Hawaii's agricultural resources, creates
6	multi-use habitats, protects native species, boosts local
7	economies, and curbs the poaching of game animals.
8	The purpose of this Act is to encourage the development of
9	hunting tourism in general and private and commercial shooting
10	preserves in particular.
11	SECTION 2. Section 183D-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
13	"(b) The hunting license fee shall be:
14	(1) \$10 for any person who has resided in the State for
15	one year or longer, or who is a member of the
16	armed forces of the United States on active duty
17	and the spouse and children thereof, or who

1	elects to forgo the exemption provided in		
2	paragraph [ <del>(3);</del> ] <u>(4);</u>		
3	(2) \$95 for all other persons;		
4	(3) \$ for persons who do not meet the requirements of		
5	paragraphs (1) or (4) for a three-day period for		
6	hunting on a private or commercial shooting preserve;		
7	and		
8	$[\frac{(3)}{(4)}]$ Free to all Hawaii residents sixty-five years of		
9	age or older and to all persons with Hansen's disease		
10	who are residents of Kalaupapa, Molokai."		
11	SECTION 3. Section 183D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"\$183D-23 Licenses expire when. All licenses shall expire		
14	on June 30 next following the date of issuance" $[-]$ , except for		
15	licenses obtained pursuant to section 183D-22(b)(3)."		
16	SECTION 4. Section 183D-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
18	"(b) A person who meets the minimum age requirements		
19	adopted pursuant to subsection (c) shall be exempt from the		
20	requirements of subsection (a) if the person:		
21	(1) Was born before January 1, 1972, and at one time		
22	possessed a hunting license issued by the State;

1		provided that the person shows satisfactory proof to	
2		the department that the person had possessed the	
3		hunting license; [or]	
4	(2)	Has successfully completed a course or program of	
5		hunter education and safety [which] that is approved	
6		by the International Hunter Education Association and	
7		meets the requirements of chapter 12 of the United	
8		States Fish and Wildlife Service Federal Aid Manual,	
9		as revised; provided that the person shows	
10		satisfactory proof in the form of a certificate,	
11		wallet card, or other document issued by a state,	
12		province, or country evidencing successful completion	
13		of the course or program[+]; or	
14	(3)	Obtains a three-day hunting license pursuant to	
15		section 183D-22(b)(3) to hunt on a private or	
16		commercial shooting preserve, accompanied by a	
17		hunting guide licensed pursuant to section 183D-25.5.	
18	Upon application and satisfaction of the requirements of		
19	paragraph	(1), the department shall issue a written exemption	
20	which sha	ll be valid for the life of the person. The department	
21	shall deve	elop and maintain a list of approved hunter education	

- 1 courses described in paragraph (2) for reference by the public
- 2 and license agents."
- 3 SECTION 5. Section 183D-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 5 "(b) The fee for [the license shall be \$1;] private and
- 6 commercial shooting preserve and farmer's licenses shall be set
- 7 by the department; provided that the department may authorize
- 8 any governmental agency to breed and sell [such birds,] game
- 9 birds and may authorize any person to possess lawfully obtained
- 10 game birds. The fees collected under this subsection shall be
- 11 deposited into the wildlife revolving fund."
- 12 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

## Report Title:

Hunting Tourism

## Description:

Provides for a fee of \$ for a 3-day hunting license on a private or commercial shooting preserve with a licensed guide. Authorizes DLNR to set the fee for private and commercial shooting preserves and farmer's licenses, and requires fees to be deposited into Wildlife Revolving Fund. (HB249 HD1)
