A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that hunting tourism in
2	general and private and commercial shooting preserves in
3	particular are viable yet underdeveloped. The legislature
4	further finds that promoting hunting tourism permits
5	diversification of Hawaii's agricultural resources, creates
6	multi-use habitats, protects native species, boosts local
7	economies, and curbs the poaching of game animals.
8	The purpose of this Act is to encourage the development of
9	hunting tourism and particularly private and commercial shooting
0	preserves.
1	SECTION 2. Section 183D-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) The hunting license fee shall be:
4	(1) \$10 for any person who has resided in the State for
5	one year or longer, or who is a member of the armed
6	forces of the United States on active duty and the

spouse and children thereof, or who elects to forgo

the exemption provided in paragraph [(3);

14		section 183D-22(b)(3) to hunt on a private or

16		hunting guide licensed pursuant to section 183D-25.5.	
17	Upon application and satisfaction of the requirements of		
18	paragraph	(1), the department shall issue a written exemption	
19	[which] <u>t</u>	hat shall be valid for the life of the person. The	
20	department shall develop and maintain a list of approved hunter		
21	education	courses described in paragraph (2) for reference by	
22	the publi	c and license agents."
