A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INJURY PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. According to the department of health's injury 1 prevention and control program, injuries lead to more deaths of 2 children and young adults from age one to thirty-nine than all 3 other causes combined, including heart disease, stroke, and 4 5 In fact, injuries accounted for more than one-third of all deaths among children age one to fourteen years. 6 One type of injury that often leads to or results in death 7 is injuries to children who fall from high-rise apartment 8 buildings. Since 1991, nine children aged four or younger have 9 10 died after falling from a high-rise structure in Hawaii. legislature believes that the requirement of window guards and 11 higher lanai door locks for all residential high-rise apartment 12 buildings will help protect the lives of young children from 13 14 accidental death and injury from window, lanai, and balcony 15 falls.

The purpose of this Act is to require each county to enact
an ordinance requiring the installation of window guards and

17	(2)	On the windows, if any, in the public halls, except
18		that this section shall not apply to windows providing

20	(3)	On lanai doors of each dwelling unit in which a child
21		or children ten years of age or under reside; provided
22		that lanai door locks shall be installed no lower than
