A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SMALL BUSINESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. A strong, viable economy is integral to the		
2	overall well-being of the people of Hawaii, and small businesses		
3	have a significant impact on the state's workforce and economy.		
4	The legislature finds that small businesses contribute to our		
5	quality of life by providing essential products and services,		
6	jobs, and other employment and economic opportunities. Small		
7	businesses also fuel economic expansion for the benefit of the		
8	entire community. The legislature finds that small businesses		
9	serve a public purpose, and it is necessary that small		
10	businesses in the state be supported and assisted in their		
11	endeavors.		
12	The purpose of this Act is to assist small businesses in		
13	this state by:		
14	(1) Re-establishing the office of the small business		
15	defender, which was created by Act 168, Session Laws		
16	of 1998, but repealed by Act 202, Session Laws of		
17	Hawaii 2002, to represent, defend, and provide legal		

representation to small businesses during proceedings

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1		involving civil citations issued by a state or county	
2		agency;	
3	(2)	Allowing the small business defender to hire	
4		attorneys; and	
5	(3)	Appropriating funds for the re-establishment of the	
6		office.	
7	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by		
8	adding a	new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read	
9	as follow	rs:

11		SMALL BUSINESS DEFENDER	
12	S	-1 Small business defender. (a) There is	
13	establish	ed within the legislature a small business defender.	
14	The small	business defender shall be appointed by the senate	
15	president	and speaker of the house of representatives. The	
16	senate pr	esident and speaker of the house of representatives	
17	shall determine the salary of the small business defender. The		
18	senate president and speaker of the house of representatives ma		
19	also appoint administrative support personnel who shall assist		
20	and suppo	ort the small business defender.	
21	(1.)	Unless otherwise specifically provided by law, and	
21	(b)	Unitess Otherwise specifically provided by faw, and	
22		ten request by a small business, the small business	

1	defender	may represent, defend, and provide legal representation	
2	to any sm	all business, during any adjudicatory or contested	
3	proceedin	g involving any civil citation issued by a state or	
4	county ag	ency in which the small business is a party; provided	
5	that the	small business shall seek its own legal representation	
6	whenever	the potential remedies against the small business may	
7	include f	ines or penalties that exceed \$25,000, or may result in	
8	the suspe	nsion or revocation of a license. The small business	
9	defender	shall have the discretion to accept or refuse any case	
10	for good	cause. The small business defender may also engage in	
11	the following activities:		
12	(1)	Advocate and negotiate, upon consultation with the	
13		small business regulatory review board, with federal,	
14		state, and county agencies and officials on any matter	
15		relating to and promoting the interests of small	
16		business;	
17	(2)	Conduct investigations to secure information useful in	
18		the lawful administration of any provision in this	
19		chapter;	
20	(3)	Refer any appropriate matter to the auditor or	
21		ombudsman for examination or investigation; and	

- (4) Do any and all things necessary to effectuate the
 purposes of this chapter.
- 3 (c) Each small business shall waive and release any and
- 4 all claims, damages, causes of action, and any request for
- 5 relief made against the small business defender or staff, the
- 6 State or counties, their officers, employees, or agents, arising
- 7 from the legal representation of the small business by the small
- 8 business defender provided under this section.
- 9 (d) As used in this section, "small business" is defined
- 10 in section 201M-1.
- 11 § -2 Attorneys; staff or contract. The small business
- 12 defender may employ or retain, by contract or otherwise, one or
- 13 more attorneys who are independent of the attorney general to
- 14 provide legal services as determined by the small business
- 15 defender. The attorneys hired or contracted shall be exempted
- 16 from chapters 76, 78, and 88.
- 17 § -3 Annual report. The small business defender shall
- 18 submit an annual report to the legislature detailing its
- 19 activities and expenditures no later than twenty days prior to
- 20 convening of the regular session."

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 $\left[\frac{(22)}{(23)}\right]$ (23) By a department, in the event the attorney 1 general, for reasons deemed by the attorney general 2 good and sufficient, declines, to employ or retain an 3 attorney for a department; provided that the governor 4 thereupon waives the provision of this section. 5 For purposes of this section, the term "department" 6 includes any department, board, commission, agency, bureau, or 7 8 officer of the State. (c) Every attorney employed by any department on a full-9 time basis, except an attorney employed by the public utilities 10 commission, the labor and industrial relations appeals board, 11 12 the Hawaii labor relations board, the office of Hawaiian affairs, the Hawaii health systems corporation, the department 13 of commerce and consumer affairs in prosecution of consumer 14 complaints, insurance division, the division of consumer 15 advocacy, the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority 16 as provided in section 201B-2.5, the Hawaiian home lands trust 17 individual claims review panel, the small business defender, or 18 as grand jury counsel, shall be a deputy attorney general." 19 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general funds 20 or so much thereof as of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 21 may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to establish the 22

- 2 represent, defend, and provide legal representation to any small
- 3 business during proceedings involving civil citations issued by
- 4 a state or county agency.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the legislature
- 6 for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007;
- 10 provided that amendments made to section 28-8.3, Hawaii Revised
- 11 Statutes, by this Act shall not be repealed when that section is
- 12 repealed on June 30, 2010, or be reenacted in the form it read
- on May 5, 2004, by Act 58, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, section
- 14 14, as amended by Act 22, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, section
- 15 50, and as amended by Act 306, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006,
