## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that state departments
2	and agencies procure services in part through contracts with
3	private vendors. Increasingly, private vendors carry out these
4	services, or subcontract or otherwise procure these services,
5	from locations outside the United States. This international
6	outsourcing exacerbates unemployment and workforce dislocation
7	and deprives Hawaii and other United States residents of job
8	opportunities, including industries and jobs that the State has
9	expended development assistance resources to attract.
10	International outsourcing erodes state and county revenues by
11	drawing jobs and income away from the state. In addition,
12	international outsourcing may provide less privacy protection
13	for state residents whose personal information, in the course of
14	service delivery, may be transmitted to locations outside the
15	United States.

1 contracting with or providing economic development assistance to 2 companies that ship work offshore. 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 5 6 "§103- Contracting; overseas work prohibited; 7 certification; civil action. (a) This section shall apply to: 8 (1) All contracts made by a state governmental body; and 9 All state-funded development assistance. (2) 10 (b) No contracting governmental body shall award a 11 contract or development assistance to a vendor, bidder, 12 contractor, subcontractor, or applicant for development assistance that will perform the work at a site outside the 13 14 United States. Nothing in this section shall be construed to 15 supersede or replace existing requirements for development 16 assistant programs. 17 (c) Each vendor submitting a bid or contract to provide 18 services and all development assistance applicants shall certify 19 that the services covered by the bid, contract, or development

assistance will be performed within the United States.

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1 (d) This section shall not apply to a service covered by a 2 bid, contract, or development assistance that is not available 3 in the United States. 4 (e) The contracting governmental body may bring a civil 5 action in state or federal court to enforce this section. court shall award reasonable attorney's fees and costs to the 6 7 contracting governmental body. 8 (f) For the purpose of this section, "development 9 assistance" means any form of public assistance, including tax 10 expenditures, made for the purpose of stimulating economic development of a corporation, industry, geographic jurisdiction, 11 12 or any other sector of the State's economy, including industrial 13 development bonds; training grants; loans; loan guarantees; 14 enterprise zones; empowerment zones; tax increment financing; fee waivers; land price subsidies; infrastructure whose 15 16 principal beneficiary is a single business or defined group of 17 businesses at the time the business or businesses are built or 18 improved; matching funds; tax abatements; tax credits and tax 19 discounts of every kind, including corporate franchise, personal income, sales, and compensating use, raw material, real 20 21 property, job creation, individual investment, excise, utility,

- 1 inventory, accelerated depreciation, and research and
- 2 development tax credits and discounts."
- 3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2034.

## Report Title:

State Contracts and Development Assistance; Bans Offshore Work
