## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NOISE ABATEMENT.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that noise abatement laws
- 2 have not been effectively enforced. As the State's population
- 3 increases, especially in congested urban areas, noise abatement
- 4 has become an issue of critical concern to many residents and
- 5 visitors.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to respond to these concerns by
- 7 appropriating funds to establish county noise abatement programs
- 8 patterned after the "Click It or Ticket" seat belt program. A
- 9 concerted county effort will provide the needed organization to
- 10 enforce noise abatement county ordinances such as section
- 11 41-31.1, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu and laws under chapter
- 12 342F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and sections 291-22, 291-23,
- 13 291-24, and 291-24.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 17 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 18 2008-2009, to provide incentives to the counties to develop

- 1 noise abatement programs to enforce noise abatement laws and
- 2 ordinances. The appropriation shall be made as follows:
- 3 County of Hawaii
- 4 County of Kauai
- 5 County of Maui
- City and county of Honolulu 6
- 7 Total
- The sums appropriated shall constitute the State's share of 8
- 9 the cost of mandated programs under article VIII, section 5 of
- 10 the state constitution.
- 11 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated shall be expended by each
- 12 respective county for the purposes of this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007. 13
