## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I			
2	SECTION 1. The purpose of this part is to promote fiscal			
3	accountability with regard to agricultural land lease agreements			
4	between the State and lessees by allowing the agribusiness			
5	development corporation to contract with financial institutions			
6	to provide lease management services.			
7	SECTION 2. Section 163D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
8	amended to read as follows:			
9	"[+]\$163D-7[+] Agricultural projects; agricultural			
10	development plans. (a) The corporation may develop and			
11	implement agricultural projects where large tracts of			
12	agricultural land have been or will be taken out of productive			
13	agriculture or where, through detailed analysis, opportunities			
14	exist to exploit potential local, national, and international			
15	markets.			
16	(b) The corporation may initiate and coordinate the			
17	preparation of business and agricultural development plans for			

- 1 its projects. The plans shall include a proposal for the
- 2 organization of the enterprise, a marketing information and
- 3 strategy, the impact on existing agricultural operations
- 4 throughout the [State] state, and a recommendation for the
- 5 construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement,
- 6 alteration, or repair of any infrastructure or accessory
- 7 facilities in connection with any project.
- **8** (c) The corporation may enter into cooperative agreements
- 9 with coordinating entrepreneurs or public agencies when the
- 10 powers, services, and capabilities of the persons or agencies
- 11 are deemed necessary and appropriate for the development and
- 12 implementation of the business and agricultural development
- 13 plans.
- 14 (d) The corporation may purchase, accept, and maintain
- 15 permanent conservation easements, or transfer them to a
- 16 qualified land trust, in accordance with the Natural Resources
- 17 Conservation Service Farm and Ranch Lands Protection program.
- 18 (e) Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the
- 19 contrary, when leasing agricultural land under the corporation's
- 20 control, the corporation may contract with a financial
- 21 institution chartered under chapter 412 or a federal financial
- 22 institution, as defined under section 412:1-109, which is

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- 1 transacting business in this state to provide lease management
- 2 services. For the purposes of this subsection, "lease
- 3 management services" includes the collection of lease rent and
- 4 any other moneys owed to the corporation related to the lease of
- 5 agricultural land under the corporation's control.
- 6 [ $\frac{d}{d}$ ] (f) The agricultural planning activities of the
- 7 corporation shall be coordinated with the county planning
- 8 departments and the county land use plans, policies, and
- 9 ordinances.
- [(e)] (g) The corporation may amend the business and
- 11 agricultural development plans as may be necessary.
- 12  $\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$  (h) Any undertaking by the corporation pursuant to
- 13 this chapter shall be with the express written consent of the
- 14 landowner or landowners directly affected."
- 15 PART II
- 16 SECTION 3. The purpose of this part is to ensure the long-
- 17 term availability of lands suitable for agricultural activities
- 18 by authorizing the agribusiness development corporation to lease
- 19 lands acquired under this Act for up to fifty-five years.
- 20 SECTION 4. Section 163D-15.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:

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"[+]$163D-15.6 Commitment and preservation of agricultural
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    leases.[+] (a) The agribusiness development corporation shall
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    work toward obtaining commitments from landowners in the leeward
    and central districts of Oahu that their agricultural leases
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    shall be for a duration of twenty or more years [\tau] and shall not
    be amended or revoked [in order] to allow for a nonagricultural
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    use of [such] the land[-]; provided that for lands in central
    Oahu acquired under Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, the
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    agricultural leases shall be for no more than fifty-five years.
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              To further ensure the preservation of agriculture in
    the leeward and central districts of Oahu, the agribusiness
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    development corporation shall monitor the agricultural leases of
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    lands [utilizing] using the water from the Waiahole water
    system. In the event of any proposed amendment or revocation of
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    any such lease, the corporation shall do all things within its
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    powers under [+]this chapter[+] to protect and defend the
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    interests of the agricultural leaseholders to ensure the
    continuation of agricultural use for those lands."
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                                 PART III
         SECTION 5. The purpose of this part is to comply with
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    article XI, sections 3 and 10 of the state constitution,
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    relating to the protection of agricultural lands and the
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- 1 promotion of farm ownership and diversified agriculture, by
- 2 establishing a process to ensure that certain lands in the Kunia
- 3 or Ewa areas, or both, on the island of Oahu:
- 4 (1) Remain available for agricultural use;
- 5 (2) Are properly managed to ensure continued economic
- 6 viability while being used for agriculture; and
- 7 (3) Are managed in a manner that is sensitive to and
- 8 consistent with the needs of farmers in the Kunia or
- 9 Ewa areas, or both.
- 10 The legislature finds that this part is in accordance with
- 11 article XI, sections 3 and 10 of the state constitution, is in
- 12 the public interest, and will preserve agricultural activities
- 13 in the area and a lifestyle that benefits the Kunia or Ewa
- 14 communities, or both, and the communities at large.
- 15 SECTION 6. (a) The agribusiness development corporation
- 16 is authorized to purchase agricultural lands located in the
- 17 Kunia or Ewa areas, or both, on the island of Oahu.
- 18 (b) The agribusiness development corporation may purchase
- 19 the lands with a combination of revenues derived through the
- 20 issuance of revenue bonds pursuant to section 163D-9, Hawaii
- 21 Revised Statutes, and moneys appropriated under section 8 of
- 22 this Act.

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- 1 The agribusiness development corporation shall submit 2 to the legislature a progress report on its actions to obtain Kunia or Ewa agricultural lands, or both, no later than twenty 3 4 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2008. 5 SECTION 7. Section 163D-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 6 7 "(a) The corporation, with the approval of the governor, may issue, from time to time, revenue bonds in amounts not 8 9 exceeding the total amount of bonds authorized to be issued by 10 the legislature for the purpose of constructing, acquiring, remodeling, furnishing, and equipping any project facility, 11 12 including the acquisition of the site thereof [-], or for 13 acquiring agricultural lands through purchase to sustain and 14 preserve viable agricultural enterprises within a contiguous 15 geographic area." 16 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for 19 purchasing agricultural lands in Kunia or Ewa, or both, on the 20 island of Oahu.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the agribusiness development corporation for the purposes of this part.

## Report Title:

Agricultural Lands; Agribusiness; Kunia and Ewa

## Description:

Authorizes the agribusiness development corporation to use revenue bonds to purchase agricultural land, including in Kunia or Ewa, or both, on Oahu. Appropriates funds to purchase the Kunia/Ewa lands. Enables the agribusiness development corporation to contract with banks to provide lease management services. Allows the agribusiness development corporation to lease agricultural lands in Kunia/Ewa for up to 55 years (HB337 HD2).
