#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REMOTE DISPENSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend the law
2	governing pharmacists and pharmacies to permit the operation of
3	remote dispensing pharmacies. It is not intended to exclude the
4	use of remote dispensing technology as practitioner dispensing.
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding five new sections to be appropriately
7	designated and to read as follows:
8	"§461-A Remote dispensing machine. Drugs dispensed to
9	patients from a remote dispensing machine shall be dispensed as
10	packaged.
11	The remote dispensing machine shall include the following
12	safety features:
13	(1) Secure double-locked cabinets;
14	(2) Bar-coding or similar technology to identify the
15	product in each unit of use container;
16	(3) Delivery of only one bar-coded unit of use container
17	per dispensation per prescription;

1	(4)	Technology allowing the unit of use container bar code
2		to be scanned upon release of the container from the
3		remote dispensing machine to confirm that it is the
4		correct container, and upon such confirmation,
5		producing a patient-specific label with a barcode that
6		is scanned to confirm that it is the correct label for
7		the prescription; and
8	(5)	A telecommunications and live audio and video
9		component allowing the patient to have a face-to-face
10		consultation with a pharmacist of the responsible
11		pharmacy at the time the drug is dispensed.
12	<u>§461</u>	-B Remote dispensing pharmacy. Each remote dispensing
13	pharmacy	shall serve only one responsible pharmacy. The
14	responsib	le pharmacy may operate more than one remote dispensing
15	pharmacy.	The following must be conspicuously displayed on the
16	premises	of the remote dispensing pharmacy:

14	be supervis	ed by the pharmacist-in-charge of the responsible
15	pharmacy, w	ho shall ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy
16	is in compl	iance with all laws, including rules, governing the
17	practice of	pharmacy.
18	(c) A	remote dispensing pharmacy shall be staffed by at
19	least one r	remote dispensing technician.
20	(d) A	remote dispensing pharmacy shall be secured at all
21	times to pr	covert unauthorized aggogg

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1	(e) A pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy shall
2	maintain visual oversight and continuous surveillance of the
3	remote dispensing pharmacy when the remote dispensing pharmacy
4	is in operation.
5	(f) A remote dispensing pharmacy shall maintain an area
6	appropriate for confidential communications between the patient
7	and a pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy.
8	(g) A pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy shall
9	maintain visual oversight of the final dispensing of a drug to
10	the patient from a remote dispensing machine.
11	(h) Drugs shall not be dispensed by the remote dispensing
12	pharmacy when the responsible pharmacy is closed.
13	(i) A remote dispensing pharmacy shall use the information
14	technology system of the responsible pharmacy.
15	(j) Each unit of use container dispensed by a remote
16	dispensing machine shall have a label affixed to the container
17	that meets the requirements set forth in section 328-16 and
18	includes the address of the remote dispensing pharmacy.
19	Labels shall be generated at the remote dispensing
20	pharmacy.
21	(k) Prescription records filled at the remote dispensing
22	pharmacy shall be maintained at the responsible pharmacy and

1	shall be dist	inguishable from the prescription records filled at
2	the responsib	ole pharmacy.
3	(1) A <u>r</u>	pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy shall approve
4	each prescrip	otion before it is dispensed to a patient at the
5	remote disper	nsing pharmacy.
6	(m) The	e remote dispensing technician shall offer the
7	patient couns	seling by a pharmacist for each prescription to be
8	filled at a m	remote dispensing pharmacy.
9	(n) Cor	ntrolled substances shall not be dispensed from
10	remote disper	nsing machines.
11	<u>§461-E</u>	Responsible pharmacy; duties, responsibilities, and
12	requirements	(a) The responsible pharmacy shall:
13	<u>(1)</u> <u>De</u> r	velop written policies and procedures prior to using
14	<u>a 1</u>	remote dispensing machine that ensure the following:
15	(A)	The safe and effective dispensing of
16		pharmaceutical products to the correct patient,
17		including ensuring that a prescription drug shall
18		not be dispensed at the remote dispensing
19		pharmacy until a pharmacist of the responsible
20		pharmacy has verified the finished prescription
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41		drug using the live computer, video, or audio

1	<u>(B)</u>	Patient confidentiality;
2	(C)	That only one prescription shall be dispensed
3		from and labeled by the remote dispensing machine
4		before another prescription is released from the
5		remote dispensing machine;
6	<u>(D)</u>	The physical presence of the patient when the
7		drug is dispensed from the remote dispensing
8		machine;
9	<u>(E)</u>	The safety, accuracy, and security of the remote
10		dispensing machine and remote dispensing
11		pharmacy;
12	<u>(F)</u>	Defined access to the remote dispensing machine
13		and to medications contained within or associated
14		with the remote dispensing machine, including but
15		not limited to policies that assign, discontinue,
16		or change access to the remote dispensing machine
17		and medications; provided that a pharmacist of
18		the responsible pharmacy shall have secured
19		access to the drugs in the remote dispensing
20		machine;
21	<u>(G)</u>	Compliance with all state and federal laws and
22		regulations;

1		<u>(H)</u>	That	if a patient refuses the prescription drug
2			at t	he time it is dispensed, the prescription
3			drug	shall be locked in a secured cabinet
4			acce	ssible only to a pharmacist of the
5			resp	onsible pharmacy; and
6		<u>(I)</u>	Prop	er inventory control at the remote dispensing
7			phar	macy, including the following:
8			<u>(i)</u>	Only a pharmacist of the responsible
9				pharmacy shall stock the remote dispensing
10				machine;
11			<u>(ii)</u>	A pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy is
12				responsible for maintaining the integrity of
13				the drugs in the remote dispensing machine;
14		(	iii)	Drugs for the remote dispensing machine are
15				provided to the remote dispensing pharmacy
16				only from the responsible pharmacy; and
17			(iv)	A reconciliation of the physical inventory
18				of the remote dispensing pharmacy shall be
19				conducted at least annually.
20	(2)	Trai	n all	personnel who operate the remote dispensing
21		mach	ine a	t the remote dispensing pharmacy:

1		<u>(A)</u>	In a manner that ensures the competence and
2			ability of all personnel who operate any
3			component of the remote dispensing pharmacy and
4			the remote dispensing machine; and
5		<u>(B)</u>	With documentation of such training to be
6			retained by the responsible pharmacy;
7	(3)	Ensu	re that the remote dispensing machine is stocked
8		accui	rately and in accordance with the established
9		writt	cen policies and procedures, including ensuring
10		that	a pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy checks
11		the a	accuracy of the product supplied for stocking the
12		remot	te dispensing machine;
13		<u>and</u>	
14	(4)	Ensu	re that entry to the remote dispensing pharmacy is
15		<u>limi</u>	ted to authorized personnel.
16	(b)	The p	pharmacist-in-charge of the responsible pharmacy
17	shall be	respoi	nsible for ensuring the meeting of the
18	requireme	nts i	n subsection (a)."
19	SECT	ON 3	. Chapter 461-1 is amended by adding the following
20	definitio	ns to	be appropriately inserted and to read as follows:
21	" <u>"</u> Re	mote o	dispensing" means the dispensing of drugs by a
22	responsib	le pha	armacy at a location other than that of the



- responsible pharmacy through the use of a remote dispensing 1 2 machine. 3 "Remote dispensing machine" means a machine that contains unit of use drugs for dispensing that is operated using 4 5 information technologies and connected to the responsible pharmacy by telecommunications and live audio and video 6 7 technology. 8 "Remote dispensing pharmacy" means the area in an 9 institutional health care facility located in this state that is 10 used exclusively for the storage and dispensing of pharmacy-11 dispensed prescription drugs through the use of one or more 12 remote dispensing machines. 13 "Remote dispensing technician" means an individual who 14 assists the pharmacist in operating a remote dispensing pharmacy 15 by providing services that include technical assistance in the 16 preparation of pharmaceuticals for remote dispensing while under 17 the supervision of a pharmacist. 18 "Responsible pharmacy" means the pharmacy that operates the 19 remote dispensing pharmacy. "Unit of use" means drugs packed in a container in 20
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separate, one-dose units."

1 SECTION 4. Section 461-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§461-9 Pharmacist in charge; pharmacy personnel. 4 registered pharmacist shall be in personal and immediate charge 5 of the pharmacy and personnel employed in the pharmacy. 6 Temporary absences of the registered pharmacist shall be 7 unlawful except for periods of time and under circumstances as 8 authorized under the rules of the board. During any absence of 9 the registered pharmacist, prescriptions may not be filled, 10 compounded, or received by telephone and no drugs shall be sold; 11 provided that this shall not preclude the sale at those times of 12 things that might be sold were the pharmacy a store not subject **13** to this chapter. No person other than a registered pharmacist 14 or a pharmacy intern under the registered pharmacist's immediate 15 supervision shall fill or compound prescriptions except as 16 provided by subsection (c). 17 No person shall practice as a pharmacy intern without 18 having first obtained a permit from the board. The board shall 19 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 defining the functions of a 20 pharmacy intern, establishing the requirements to be met by an 21 applicant for a pharmacy intern permit, and specifying the

- 1 duration of the permit and the procedures for the immediate
- 2 supervision of the pharmacy intern by a registered pharmacist.
- 3 (c) A pharmacy technician may be employed to assist the
- 4 registered pharmacist under rules adopted by the board pursuant
- 5 to chapter 91 that define the qualifications and functions of
- 6 the pharmacy technician and provide the procedures for control
- 7 and supervision by a registered pharmacist.
- **8** (d) A pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy shall
- 9 supervise at all times any remote dispensing technicians at the
- 10 remote dispensing pharmacy."
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 461-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "§461-14 Permits for operation of pharmacy[-];
- 14 notification of remote dispensing pharmacy. (a) It shall be
- 15 unlawful for any person to operate, maintain, open, change
- 16 location, or establish any pharmacy or remote dispensing
- 17 pharmacy within the [State] state without [first] having first
- 18 obtained a permit or prior notification from the board.
- 19 (b) Application for permits and notifications shall be
- 20 made on a form to be prescribed by the board. Separate
- 21 [application] applications shall be made and separate permits
- 22 and notifications issued for each separate place at which is



1	carried o	n any of the operations for which a permit <u>or</u>
2	notificat	ion is required.
3	(c)	On evidence satisfactory to the board, a permit or
4	notificat	ion shall be issued[, provided:]; provided that:
5	(1)	[That the] The pharmacy for which the permit or
6		<u>notification</u> is sought is or will $be[\tau]$ in full
7		compliance with this chapter and rules of the board;
8	(2)	[That the] The location and appointments of the
9		pharmacy are such that it can be operated and
10		maintained without endangering the public health or
11		safety; and
12	(3)	[ <del>That the</del> ] <u>The</u> pharmacy will be under the personal and
13		immediate supervision of a registered pharmacist.
14	(d)	[No application] An application for a permit shall be
15	refused [	except pursuant to] for noncompliance with this section
16	[ <del>and</del> ] but	only after notice to the applicant and a full and fair
17	hearing.	
18	(e)	To operate a remote dispensing pharmacy, a responsible
19	pharmacy	shall submit to the board the following information:
20	(1)	A form prescribed by the board;
21	(2)	The name, address, and permit number of the
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1	(3)	The name and license number of the pharmacist-in-
2		charge of the responsible pharmacy;
3	(4)	The name of the institutional health care facility and
4		the address of the remote dispensing pharmacy;
5	(5)	A floor plan of the remote dispensing pharmacy, which
6		shall indicate the space or location of the remote
7		dispensing machine;
8	(6)	The date the remote dispensing pharmacy will be ready
9		for operations;
10	<u>(7)</u>	A description of the security system;
11	(8)	A description of the computer link, video link, and
12		audio link; and
13	(9)	Photographs of the remote dispensing pharmacy area,
14		including but not limited to the remote dispensing
15		machine, the security system, computer link, video
16		link, audio link, confidential-communications area,
17		and locked cabinet.
18	<u>A re</u>	mote dispensing pharmacy's failure to notify the board
19	in writin	g within thirty days of any changes to the information
20	described	in paragraphs (1) to (9) or failure to comply with
21	this chap	ter shall be considered a violation of this chapter and

- 1 shall result in disciplinary action against the pharmacist-in-
- 2 charge and the responsible pharmacy.
- 3 (f) Permits and licenses issued under sections 461-14 and
- 4 461-15 may be closed upon written request from the holder of the
- 5 permit or license. The board shall approve all requests by the
- 6 holder for closure of a permit of license. Once the closure is
- 7 approved, the holder of the closed permit or license shall be
- 8 required to reapply as a new applicant to conduct business where
- 9 a permit or license is required."
- 10 SECTION 6. Section 461-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 "§461-16 Fees for permits and licenses; renewal. (a) The
- 13 board shall collect application, license, and permit fees for
- 14 each permit to operate a pharmacy or for each license to operate
- 15 as a wholesale prescription drug distributor and a fee for the
- 16 issuance of a permit in accordance with section 461-15(a)(1),
- **17** (5), (6), and (7).
- 18 (b) Permits issued under sections 461-14 and 461-15 and
- 19 licenses issued under section 461-8.6 shall be conspicuously
- 20 displayed in the place for which the permit or license was
- 21 granted. The permits and licenses shall not be transferable,

- 1 shall expire on December 31 of each odd-numbered year following
- 2 the date of issuance, and shall be renewed biennially.
- 3 (c) The holder of an expired permit or an expired license
- 4 to operate as a wholesale prescription drug distributor may have
- 5 the same restored within three years of the date of expiration
- 6 upon due application therefor and payment of the delinquent fees
- 7 and a penalty fee; provided that in the case of an expired
- 8 permit, the holder of the expired permit meets the requirements
- 9 for the renewal of permits.
- 10 (d) Permits and licenses issued under sections 461-14 and
- 11 461-15 may be closed upon written request from the holder of the
- 12 permit or license. The board shall approve all requests by the
- 13 holder for closure of a permit of license. Once the closure is
- 14 approved, the holder of the closed permit or license shall be
- 15 required to reapply as a new applicant to conduct business where
- 16 a permit or license is required."
- 17 SECTION 7. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 18 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 19 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 20 the new sections in this Act.
- 21 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

#### Report Title:

Remote dispensing pharmacies

#### Description:

Provides for the establishment of remote dispensing pharmacies.
