A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE VACANCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 17-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: "§17-1 United States senator. When a vacancy occurs in 3 4 the office of United States senator the vacancy shall be filled 5 for the unexpired term at the following state general election, 6 provided that the vacancy occurs not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 7 sixtieth day prior to the primary for nominating candidates to 8 be voted for at the election; otherwise at the state general 9 election next following. The chief election officer shall issue 10 a proclamation designating the election for filling the vacancy. Pending the election, the governor shall make a temporary 11 12 appointment to fill the vacancy [and the] by selecting a person from a list of three prospective appointees submitted by the 13 14 same political party as the prior incumbent. The person [so] 15 appointed shall serve until the election and qualification of 16 the person duly elected to fill the vacancy and shall be, at the 17 time of appointment, and shall have been, for at least six 18 months immediately prior to the appointment, a registered member

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    of the same political party as the [senator causing the
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    vacancy.] prior incumbent. If the prior incumbent was not a
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    member of any political party, the governor shall appoint a
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    person who is not and has not been, for at least six months
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    immediately prior to the appointment, a registered member of any
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    political party. All candidates for the unexpired term shall be
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    nominated and elected in accordance with this title."
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         SECTION 2. Section 17-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§17-3 State senator.
                                (a) Whenever any vacancy in the

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    the next succeeding general election[, the]:

              The governor shall make an appointment within sixty
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              calendar days following the first day of vacancy to
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              fill the vacancy for the unexpired term [and the
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              appointee shall be of] by selecting a person from a
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              list of three prospective appointees submitted by the
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              same political party [or nonpartisanship] as the
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              [person the appointee succeeds.] prior incumbent.

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              prospective appointees shall be, at the time of
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              appointment, and shall have been, for at least six
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              months immediately prior to the appointment,
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1		registered members of the political party. The
2		political party shall submit the list of prospective
3		appointees to the governor within thirty calendar days
4		following the first day of vacancy; and
5	(2)	If the prior incumbent was not a member of any
6		political party, the governor, within sixty calendar
7		days following the first day of vacancy, shall appoint
8		a person who is not and has not been, for a least six
9		months immediately prior to the appointment, a
10		registered member of any political party.
11	(b)	In the case of a vacancy, the term of which does not
12	end at th	e next succeeding general election:
13	(1)	If it occurs not later than on the tenth day prior to
14		the close of filing for the next succeeding primary
15		election, the vacancy shall be filled for the
16		unexpired term at the next succeeding general
17		election. The chief election officer shall issue a
18		proclamation designating the election for filling the
19		vacancy. All candidates for the unexpired term shall
20		be nominated and elected in accordance with this
21		title. Pending the election the governor shall make a
22		temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the

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1		person [so] appointed shall serve until the election
2		of the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The
3		[appointee shall be of] governor shall make the
4		appointment from a list of three prospective
5		appointees submitted by the same political party [or
6		nonpartisanship] as the [person the appointee
7		succeeds.] prior incumbent. The prospective
8		appointees shall be, at the time of appointment, and
9		shall have been, for at least six months immediately
10		prior to the appointment, registered members of the
11		political party. If the prior incumbent was not a
12		member of any political party, the governor shall
13		appoint a person who is not and has not been, for at
14		least six months immediately prior to the appointment,

16	(2)	If it occurs later than on the tenth day prior to the
17		close of filing for the next succeeding primary
18		election but not later than on the sixtieth day prior
19		to the next succeeding primary election, or if there
20		are no qualified candidates for any party or
21		nonpartisan candidates qualified for the primary
22		election ballot, nominations for the unexpired term



1	may be filed not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fiftieth
2	day prior to the next succeeding primary election.
3	The chief election officer shall issue a proclamation
4	designating the election for filling the vacancy.
5	Pending the election the governor shall make a
6	temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
7	person so appointed shall serve until the election of
8	the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The
9	[appointee shall be of] governor shall make the
10	appointment from a list of three prospective
11	appointees submitted by the same political party or
12	nonpartisanship as the [person the appointee
13	succeeds.] prior incumbent. The prospective
14	appointees shall be, at the time of appointment, and
15	shall have been, for at least six months immediately
16	prior to the appointment, registered members of the
17	political party. If the prior incumbent was not a
18	member of any political party, the governor shall
19	appoint a person who is not and has not been, for at
20	least six months immediately prior to the appointment,
21	a registered member of any political party;

1	(3)	If it occurs after the sixtieth day prior to the next
2		succeeding primary but not later than on the fiftieth
3		day prior to the next succeeding general election, or
4		if there are no qualified candidates for any party or
5		nonpartisan candidates in the primary, the vacancy
6		shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next
7		succeeding general election. The chief election
8		officer shall issue a proclamation designating the
9		election for filling the vacancy. Party candidates
10		for the unexpired senate term shall be nominated by
11		the county committees of the parties not later than
12		4:30 p.m. on the fortieth day prior to the general
13		election; nonpartisan candidates may file nomination
14		papers for the unexpired term not later than 4:30 p.m.
15		on the fortieth day prior to the general election with
16		the nonpartisan candidate who is to be nominated to be
17		decided by lot, under the supervision of the chief
18		election officer. The candidates for the unexpired
19		term shall be elected in accordance with this title.
20		Pending the election, the governor shall make a
21		temporary appointment to fill the vacancy, and the
22		person so appointed shall serve until the election of

1		the person duly elected to fill [such] the vacancy.
2		The [appointee shall be of] governor shall make the
3		appointment from a list of three prospective
4		appointees submitted by the same political party [or
5		nonpartisanship] as the [person the appointee
6		succeeds.] prior incumbent. The prospective
7		appointees shall be, at the time of appointment, and
8		shall have been, for at least six months immediately
9		prior to the appointment, registered members of the
10		political party. If the prior incumbent was not a
11		member of any political party, the governor shall
12		appoint a person who is not and has not been, for at
13		least six months immediately prior to the appointment,
14		a registered member of any political party; and
15	(4)	If it occurs after the fiftieth day prior to the next
16		succeeding general election or if no candidates are
17		nominated, the governor shall make an appointment to
18		fill the vacancy for the unexpired term [and the
19		appointee shall be of] by selecting a person from a
20		list of three prospective appointees submitted by the
21		same political party [or nonpartisanship] as the
22		[person the appointee succeeds.] prior incumbent. The



1	prospective appointees shall be, at the time of
2	appointment, and shall have been, for at least six
3	months immediately prior to the appointment,
4	registered members of the political party. If the
5	prior incumbent was not a member of any political
6	party, the governor shall appoint a person who is not
7	and has not been, for at least six months immediately
8	prior to the appointment, a registered member of any
9	political party."
10	SECTION 3. Section 17-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended to read as follows:
12	"\$17-4 State representatives. Whenever any vacancy in the
13	membership of the state house of representatives occurs, the
14	governor shall make an appointment within sixty calendar days
15	following the first day of vacancy to fill the vacancy for the
16	unexpired term [and the appointee shall be of] by selecting a
17	person from a list of three prospective appointees submitted by
18	the same political party or nonpartisanship as the [person the
19	appointee succeeds. prior incumbent. The prospective
20	appointees shall be at the time of appointment, and shall have
21	been, for at least six months immediately prior to the
22	appointment, registered members of the political party. The
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- 1 political party shall submit the list of prospective appointees
- 2 to the governor within thirty calendar days following the first
- 3 day of vacancy.
- (b) If the prior incumbent was not a member of any
- 5 political party, the governor, within sixty calendar days
- 6 following the first day of vacancy, shall appoint a person who
- 7 is not and has not been, for at least six months immediately
- 8 prior to the appointment, a registered member of any political
- 9 party."
- 10 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Requires the governor, in filling vacancies in the senate, house of representatives, and U.S. Senate, to select from a list of three prospective appointees nominated by the political party of the prior incumbent. Requires prospective appointees to be registered members of nominating political parties for at least six months prior to the appointment. Effective on approval.
