A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIABILITY OF STATE AND COUNTY GOVERNMENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the limitations on state and county liability have proven to be beneficial to the 2 state and county governments, as well as the public. The 3 liability protections have reduced the exposure of the state and 4 5 county governments to substantial damages and, as a result, have allowed the state and county governments to keep public beach 6 parks with potentially dangerous conditions open to the public. 7 The legislature further finds that state and county compliance 8 9 with the statutorily required public warning of dangerous conditions at public beach parks has contributed to an 10 11 improvement in public safety in these areas, which justifies making the current liability exemptions for state and county 12 governments relating to public beach parks and actions of county 13 14 lifequards permanent.

15 The purpose of this Act is to provide state and county 16 governments with liability protection for public use of public 17 beach parks. This Act also provides state and county
