A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOPEDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: "§286-21 Vehicles and mopeds without required equipment or 3 4 in unsafe condition. No person shall drive or cause to move on any highway any motor vehicle, moped, trailer, semitrailer, or 5 6 pole trailer, or any combination thereof, unless the equipment 7 thereon is in good working order and adjustment as required in 8 this part [so as not to] and does not endanger the driver or 9 other occupant or any person [upon] on the highway." SECTION 2. Section 286-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 11 amended by amending subsections (a) to (c) to read as follows: "(a) [The chief of police or any police officer of any 12 13 county may, at] At any time when the chief of police or police 14 officer has reasonable cause to believe that a vehicle or moped is unsafe or not equipped as required by law, the chief of 15 16 police or any police officer of any county may require the owner 17 or driver of the vehicle or moped to submit the vehicle or moped 18 to an inspection or make the necessary corrections or repairs. 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              If the vehicle or moped is found to be in an unsafe
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    condition or if any required part or equipment is not present or
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    if any required part or equipment is present but not in proper
    repair, the officer shall issue a citation to the owner or
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    driver stating the reasons that the vehicle or moped is deemed
    unsafe or not equipped as required and shall require that a new
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    certificate of inspection as provided in section 286-26 be
    obtained within five days or that the defect be cured.
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              If upon inspection, the chief of police or any police
    officer determines that any vehicle or moped is in such unsafe
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    condition as to constitute a menace to the public or is not
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    equipped as required and cannot reasonably be restored to a safe
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    condition or equipped as required in this part, the chief of
    police or police officer shall remove the sticker [which] that
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    signifies the certificate of inspection and with regard to
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    vehicles inform the director of finance who shall [forthwith]
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    immediately suspend the registration of the vehicle and give
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    notice of the suspension to its owner. Whenever the director of
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    finance has suspended the registration of any vehicle under this
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    part, the owner of the vehicle shall immediately surrender and
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    forward to the director of finance the certificate of
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1 registration and the license plates last issued upon 2 registration of the vehicle for the current year." 3 SECTION 3. Section 286-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 5 "(b) No person shall operate any vehicle or moped after 6 receiving a citation with reference thereto as provided in 7 section 286-22(b), except that if the driver is authorized to do 8 so by the police officer, the driver may return the vehicle or 9 moped to the driver's residence or place of business or the **10** residence or place of business of the owner of the vehicle[7] or 11 moped, or to an automotive repair shop, if within a distance of 12 twenty miles, until a certificate of inspection is obtained or 13 the necessary corrections or repairs are made." 14 SECTION 4. Section 286-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows: 16 [Registered owner's responsibility; registration 17 plates as prima facie evidence as to the fault of the registered 18 owner.] Responsibility of owner or operator for violation. In any 19 proceeding for violation of this part, the registered owner of a 20 vehicle or the operator of a moped shall be deemed responsible for

the unsafe condition of the vehicle[-] or moped, or the failure to

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equip the moped as required by law."

- 1 SECTION 5. Section 286-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§286-25 Operation of a vehicle or moped without a
- 4 certificate of inspection. Whoever operates, permits the
- 5 operation of, causes to be operated, or parks any vehicle or
- 6 moped on a public highway without a current official certificate
- 7 of inspection, issued under section 286-26, shall be fined [not
- 8 more than] up to \$100."
- 9 SECTION 6. Section 286-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 10 as follows:
- 11 1. By amending subsections (b) and (c) to read:
- "(b) [All other] Mopeds and vehicles[7] other than those
- 13 under subsection (a), including motorcycles, trailers,
- 14 semitrailers, and pole trailers having a gross vehicle weight
- 15 rating of 10,000 pounds or less, and antique motor vehicles as
- 16 defined in section 249-1, except those in subsections (c) and
- 17 (d), shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) every
- 18 twelve months; provided that any vehicle or moped to which this
- 19 subsection applies shall not require inspection within two years
- 20 of the date on which the vehicle was first sold.

- 1 (c) Any vehicle or moped that has been involved in an
- 2 accident shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) before
- 3 it is operated again if:
- 4 (1) It is determined by a police officer or an insurer
- 5 that the vehicle's equipment has been damaged so as to
- 6 render the vehicle unsafe; or
- 7 (2) It is rebuilt or restored."
- 8 2. By amending subsection (e) to read:
- 9 "(e) Upon application for a certificate of inspection to
- 10 be issued for a vehicle $[\tau]$ or moped, an inspection as prescribed
- 11 by the director under subsection (g) shall be conducted on the
- 12 vehicle[7] or moped, and if the vehicle or moped is found to be
- 13 in a safe operating condition, a certificate of inspection shall
- 14 be issued upon payment of a fee to be determined by the
- 15 director. The certificate for a motor vehicle shall state the
- 16 effective date, the termination date, the name of the issuing
- 17 insurance carrier, and the policy number of the motor vehicle
- 18 insurance identification card for the inspected motor vehicle as
- 19 specified by section 431:10C-107 or state the information
- 20 contained in the proof of insurance card as specified by section
- 21 431:10G-106. A sticker, authorized by the director, shall be
- 22 affixed to the vehicle or moped at the time a certificate of



- 1 inspection is issued. An inspection sticker [which] that has
- 2 been lost, stolen, or destroyed shall be replaced without
- 3 reinspection by the inspection station that issued the original
- 4 inspection sticker upon presentation of the [vehicle's] current
- 5 certificate of inspection[+] for the vehicle or moped; provided
- 6 that the current certificate of inspection and inspection
- 7 sticker shall not have expired at the time the replacement is
- 8 requested. The director shall adopt rules to determine the fee
- 9 for replacement of lost, stolen, or destroyed inspection
- 10 stickers."
- 11 3. By amending subsection (g) to read:
- 12 "(g) The director of transportation shall adopt necessary
- 13 rules for the administration of inspections and the issuance of
- 14 certificates of inspection[-]; provided that the rules regarding
- 15 inspection of mopeds shall be limited to implementing the
- 16 requirement that mopeds be operated only with an exhaust system
- 17 that meets original manufacturer specifications."
- 18 SECTION 7. Section 286-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "\$286-30 False certificates. Any person who makes,
- 21 issues, or knowingly uses any imitation or counterfeit of an
- 22 official certificate of inspection, or any person who displays



- 1 or causes or permits to be displayed upon any vehicle or moped
- 2 any certificate of inspection knowing the same to be issued for
- 3 another vehicle or issued without an inspection having been made
- 4 or issued without authority as provided herein shall be fined
- 5 [not more than] up to \$1,000 or imprisoned [not more than] up to
- 6 thirty days, or both."
- 7 SECTION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun, before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect January 1, 2050.
