A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that recent changes to 2 the federal temporary assistance for needy families program rules and subsequent first-to-work program changes, which limit 3 4 educational activities to two years of study leading to 5 vocational or technical degrees to meet federal work 6 requirements, exempts currently participating students and 7 allows them to finish their education. For example, current first-to-work participating students who are pursuing a 8 9 baccalaureate degree are transferred to the state-funded bridge 10 to hope program to continue their studies. However, new federal 11 temporary assistance for needy families program first-to-work 12 participating students are restricted to the new two-year education activity option to receive vocational or technical 13 14 These students will no longer be able to continue to 15 pursue a four-year baccalaureate degree in favorite areas of 16 study such as pre-nursing without violating federal work rules. 17 The purpose of this Act is to make clarifying amendments 18 and appropriate funds to the bridge to hope program to enable

- 5 SECTION 2. Section 346-68, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- 7 "(a) There is created within the department a post-
- 8 secondary education benefits program, to be known as the bridge
- 9 to hope program, for heads of households receiving financial
- 10 assistance and participating in the [temporary assistance to
- 11 needy families program.] first-to-work programs.
- (b) To receive assistance under this program, the [single]
- 13 parent shall:
- 14 (1) Be enrolled as a student each [term;] term in an
- approved course of study, not limited to vocational
- 16 education;
- 17 (2) Maintain passing grades or better throughout the
- 18 course of study; and
- 19 (3) Meet work activity requirements as defined by the
- 20 department."
- 21 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 22 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much

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- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
- 2 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 3 2008-2009 for the bridge to hope program to accommodate new
- 4 federal temporary assistance for needy families program first-
- 5 to-work students to enable them to pursue educational activities
- 6 beyond the new two-year federal limit.
- 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 8 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020,
- 12 except that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Bridge to Hope; Educational Activities; Appropriation

Description:

Appropriates funds to the Bridge to Hope Program to accommodate new federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program first-to-work students to enable them to pursue education activities beyond the new two-year federal limit. Makes other clarifying amendments. (HB473 HD2)
