## H.B. NO. 47

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUN PROTECTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Purpose. The legislature finds that inadequate 2 protection against the sun's harmful effects can have deadly 3 consequences. Excessive sun exposure will cause skin cancer in 4 one out of every five Americans and contribute to fifty-eight 5 per cent of the blindness caused by cataracts worldwide. More 6 than one million Americans will be diagnosed with skin cancer 7 this year, which is more than all other types of cancer 8 combined. Over ten thousand Americans (more than one per hour) 9 will die from this disease.

10 The three major types of skin cancer are the highly curable
11 basal cell, the squamous cell carcinomas, and the deadliest of
12 the three -- melanoma. Melanoma is the most rapidly increasing
13 form of cancer in the United States, causing seventy-five per
14 cent of all skin cancer deaths. Skin cancer is especially
15 prevalent in Hawaii, with Kauai leading the nation in per capita
16 incidence of basal cell carcinoma.

17 The legislature also finds that sun protection during18 childhood and adolescence is particularly important because five



or more severe sunburns during adolescence more than doubles a
 child's risk of developing melanoma. It is imperative that the
 State act expeditiously to develop a comprehensive sun
 protection policy and to educate and protect public school
 students in Hawaii.

6 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 7 education and the department of human services to develop and 8 administer a sun protection program designed to protect public 9 school students and other children in group child care homes or 10 care centers, such as preschools, from the harmful effects of 11 the sun.

SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

15 "<u>§302A-</u> <u>Sun protection program.</u> (a) The department
16 shall establish and administer a sun protection program in the
17 public schools to protect students from the harmful effects of
18 the sun. The program shall include students in all public
19 school programs including after-school programs and weekend
20 community-school activities.

21 (b) The sun protection program shall include but not be
22 limited to:

1	(1)	Developing a curriculum that explains the dangers of
2		excessive sun exposure and methods to protect students
3		from the harmful effects of the sun;
4	(2)	Assessing the physical environment of all public
5		school campuses and facilities used for after-school
6		programs and weekend community-school activities to
7		determine the necessity of increasing the number of
8		shelters and trees to adequately protect students and
9		the school grounds from the sun;
10	(3)	Scheduling outdoor activities during reasonable hours
11		to protect students from excessive sun exposure;
12	(4)	Recommending the use of hats, protective clothing,
13		sunglasses, and sunscreen with a protection factor of
14		fifteen or greater to protect students from the sun;
15		and
16	(5)	Requiring regular evaluations of the sun protection
17		program by students, employees, teachers,
18		administrators, and parents.
19	(C)	The department may adopt rules under chapter 91,
20	necessary	to effectuate the purposes of this section."



1	SECTION 3. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§346- Group child care home and child care center; sun		
5	protection program. (a) The department of human services shall		
6	establish and administer a sun protection program in group child		
7	care homes or group child care centers to protect children from		
8	the harmful effects of the sun.		
9	(b) The sun protection program shall include but not be		
10	limited to:		
11	(1) Developing a curriculum that explains the dangers of		
12	sun exposure and methods to protect children from the		
13	harmful effects of the sun;		
14	(2) Assessing the physical environment of group child care		
15	home or group child care center facilities to provide		
16	recommendations on increasing the number of shelters		
17	and trees to adequately protect children and the		
18	facility grounds from the sun;		
19	(3) Developing recommendations on outdoor activity		
20	scheduling to protect children from excessive sun		
21	exposure;		



1	(4)	Recommending the use of hats, protective clothing,
2		sunglasses, and sunscreen with a protection factor of
3		fifteen or greater to protect children from the sun;
4		and
5	(5)	Obtaining regular evaluations of the sun protection
6		program by parents, children, group child care home
7		and group child care center employees and
8		administrators.
9	(c)	The department may adopt rules under chapter 91
10	necessary	to effectuate the purposes of this section."
11	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
