A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide an
2	incentive for companies bidding on State and county contracts to
3	hire the disabled and recipients of public assistance by
4	establishing a procurement preference.
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding two new sections to part X to be appropriately
7	designated and to read as follows:
8	" <u>§103D-</u> Preference for employment of persons with
9	disabilities. (a) When a governmental body contracts for
10	goods, services, or construction, a preference shall be given to
11	a bidder who pledges to hire persons with disabilities; provided
12	that the persons with disabilities are employed for the duration
13	of the contract.
14	(b) The preference amount shall be equal to the percentage
15	of individuals employed by the bidder who are persons with
16	disabilities and shall be subtracted from the offer for
17	selection purposes only; provided that:



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1	(1)	The preference amount shall not exceed five per cent	
2		of the bid price; and	
3	(2)	Part-time employees who are persons with disabilities	
4		shall be counted in proportion to the number of hours	
5		they work in a forty-hour work week.	
6	(C)	The department of human services shall:	
7	(1)	Certify the eligibility of persons who are recipients	
8		of temporary assistance for needy families; and	
9	(2)	Establish a registry of persons with disabilities who	
10		are seeking employment and who a responsive and	
11		responsible offeror may employ; provided that the	
12		department of human services first obtains the	
13		authorization of the persons before including them in	
14		the registry.	
15	(d)	For purposes of this section, "person with	
16	disabilit	ies" means an individual who has a physical or mental	
17	impairmen	t that substantially limits one or more major life	
18	activitie	s, including an individual who the department of	
19	health, d	epartment of human services, or a physician licensed	
20	under chapter 453 or 460 determines to be disabled.		
21	(e)	The policy board shall adopt rules under chapter 91 to	
22	establish	procedures consistent with this section.
