### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 88-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
3	and to read as follows:
4	"Conservation and resources enforcement officer": any
5	regularly employed member of the department of land and natural
6	resources whose principal duty is to enforce conservation laws
7	and protect the State's natural resources."
8	SECTION 2. Section 88-74.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:

Section 88-281, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 15 amended to read as follows: "§88-281 Service retirement. (a) A member who has ten 16 years of credited service and has attained age sixty-two, or a 17 member with thirty years credited service who has attained the 18 age of fifty-five, shall become eligible to receive a retirement 19 20 allowance after the member has terminated service.

(b) If a member has at least twenty-five years of credited
service as a sewer worker or as a water safety officer of which



the last five or more years prior to retirement is credited in 1 such a capacity, then the sewer worker or water safety officer 2 shall be eligible to receive a retirement benefit unreduced for 3 age after the member has terminated service. 4 (c) A member who has twenty years of credited service and 5 has attained age fifty-five shall be eligible to receive an 6 early retirement allowance reduced for age after the member has 7 8 terminated service. (d) A member who has ten years of credited service and 9 10 terminates service prior to attaining age sixty-two shall have a vested right and shall be eligible to receive a retirement 11 allowance when the member has attained age sixty-five. 12 (e) If a member has at least thirty years of credited 13 service through June 30, 2003; twenty-nine years of credited 14 service on or after July 1, 2004; twenty-eight years of credited 15 service on or after July 1, 2005; twenty-seven years of credited 16 service on or after July 1, 2006; twenty-six years of credited 17 service on or after July 1, 2007; and twenty-five years of 18 credited service on or after July 1, 2008, as an emergency 19 medical technician, of which the last five or more years prior 20 to retirement is credited service in that capacity, the 21 emergency medical technician shall be eligible to receive a 22 HB LRB 07-1232.doc

retirement benefit unreduced for age after the member has 1 2 terminated service. (f) If a member has at least twenty-five years of credited 3 service on or after July 1, 2007, as a conservation and 4 resources enforcement officer, of which the last five or more 5 years prior to retirement is credited service in that capacity, 6 7 the conservation and resources enforcement officer shall be eligible to receive a retirement benefit unreduced for age after 8 9 the member has terminated service.  $\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$  (g) A member may retire upon the written application 10 to the board, specifying the desired date of retirement, which 11 shall be not less than thirty days nor more than one hundred 12 fifty days subsequent to the date of filing. Retirement shall 13 be effective on the first day of a month, except for the month 14 of December when retirement on the first or last day of the 15 month shall be allowed." 16 SECTION 4. Section 88-282, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows: 18 "§88-282 Service retirement allowance. Upon retirement 19 20 from service, a member shall receive a retirement allowance as follows: 21

20 the conservation and resources enforcement officer shall be
21 eligible to receive a retirement benefit unreduced for age after
22 the member has terminated service.

5	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
