A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GRANTS-IN-AID.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$42F-103[+] Standards for the award of grants and
4 subsidies. (a) Grants and subsidies shall only be awarded to
5 individuals who, and organizations [which:] that:

- 6 (1)Are licensed or accredited, in accordance with 7 federal, state, or county statutes, rules, or 8 ordinances, to conduct the activities or provide the 9 services for which a grant or subsidy is awarded; 10 (2) Comply with all applicable federal and state laws 11 prohibiting discrimination against any person on the 12 basis of race, color, national origin, religion, 13 creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, or disability; 14 Agree not to use state funds for entertainment or (3)
- 15 lobbying activities; and
- 16 (4) Allow the state agency to which funds for the grant or
 17 subsidy were appropriated for expenditure, legislative
 18 committees and their staff, and the auditor full
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1 access to their records, reports, files, and other 2 related documents and information for purposes of 3 monitoring, measuring the effectiveness, and 4 [assuring] ensuring the proper expenditure of the 5 grant or subsidy. 6 (b) In addition, a grant or subsidy may be made to an 7 organization only if the organization: 8 (1)Is incorporated under the laws of the State; and 9 (2)Has bylaws or policies that describe the manner in 10 which the activities or services for which a grant or 11 subsidy is awarded shall be conducted or provided. 12 (C) Further, a grant or subsidy may be awarded to a non-13 profit organization only if the organization: 14 (1)Has been determined and designated to be a non-profit 15 organization by the Internal Revenue Service; and 16 (2) Has a governing board whose members have no material 17 conflict of interest and serve without compensation. If a grant or subsidy is used by an organization for 18 (d) 19 the acquisition of land, when the organization discontinues the 20 activities or services on the land acquired for which the grant 21 or subsidy was awarded and disposes of the land in fee simple or 22 by lease, the organization shall negotiate with the expending HB LRB 07-0566.doc

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1	agency for a lump sum or installment repayment to the State of
2	the amount of the grant or subsidy used for the acquisition of
3	the land. This restriction shall be registered, recorded,
4	docketed, and indexed in the bureau of conveyances or with the
5	assistant registrar of the land court as an encumbrance on the
6	property. Amounts received from the repayment of a grant or
7	subsidy under this subsection shall be deposited into the
8	general fund."
9	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and
10	stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title: Grant-in-Aid

Description:

Provides for the lump sum or installment repayment of a grantin-aid received by an organization that was used for the purchase of land when the activities for which the grant was made are discontinued on the land acquired and the land is sold or leased by the organization.
