8	(1)	Live	in a safe and healthy home, free from physical,		
9		psycl	nological, sexual, and other abuse;		
10	(2)	Have	adequate:		
11		<u>(A)</u>	Food that is nutritious and healthy;		
12		(B)	Clothing;		
13		(C)	Medical, dental and orthodontic, and corrective		
14	·		vision care; and		
15		<u>(D)</u>	Mental health services;		
16	(3)	<u>Have</u>	supervised in-person contact and telephone or		
17		mail	correspondence with the child's parents and		

1		siblings while in foster care unless prohibited by
2		court order;
3	(4)	Following adoption, have supervised in-person contact
4		and telephone or mail correspondence with the child's
5		parents and siblings unless prohibited by the adoption
6		decree;
7	(5)	Have direct contact with a social worker, guardian ad
8		litem, and probation officer;
9	(6)	Have the right to have their own religious beliefs and
10		the right to refuse to attend any religious activities
11		and services;
12	(7)	Have a personal bank account and manage their personal
13		income, consistent with the child's age and
14		development unless prohibited due to safety or health
15		concerns;
16	(8)	Have the right to attend school and participate in
17		appropriate extracurricular activities, and, if a
18		child is moved during a school year, the right to
19		complete the school year at the same school, if
20		practicable; and
21	(9)	Have life skills training and a transition plan
22		starting at age twelve to provide adequate

1		transitioning for children aging out of the foster
2		care system. The department shall provide written
3		information to all foster children twelve years or
4		older and their foster parents about available
5		independent living programs, including available
6		foster youth organizations, transitional planning
7		services, and independent living case management
8		programs.
9	(b)	The family court may issue any necessary orders, sua
10	sponte or	on motion of the guardian ad litem, to the department
11	of educat	ion, department of human services, or department of
12	health to	ensure adherence to the principles enumerated in
13	subsectio	n (a)."
