A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that high quality child
- 2 care plays an important role in a child's healthy development.
- 3 Quality child care during the first year enhances development of
- 4 the child's brain and cognitive abilities.
- 5 Unfortunately, many children spend their days in unsafe
- 6 settings that lack supportive, nurturing, and enriching care.
- 7 This is due in part to the national shortage of licensed and
- 8 regulated infant child care professionals. Another factor is
- 9 the high cost of child care for children under two years of age,
- 10 which requires smaller groups of children and is more labor
- 11 intensive and, therefore, more costly to provide. These factors
- 12 make it difficult for many low-income parents to find
- 13 affordable, quality child care.
- 14 Child care subsidies for low-income parents and parents
- 15 receiving temporary assistance for needy families funds enable
- 16 them to work or participate in educational or training programs.
- 17 These subsidies have enabled many public assistance recipients



- 1 to return to the work force. Changes to welfare policy relating
- 2 to work requirements have made the option to stay home to care
- 3 for very young children impractical for many low-income parents.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to allow certain qualifying
- 5 recipients of public assistance to provide full-time, at-home
- 6 child care to children two years of age or less, and to receive
- 7 a percentage of the child care subsidy the State would otherwise
- 8 pay for the child care.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 11 and to read as follows:
- 12 "§346- At-home infant child care program. (a) The
- 13 department may grant a child care subsidy to a parent who is a
- 14 qualified recipient of public assistance for that parent to
- 15 provide full-time, at-home child care for the parent's child age
- 16 two years or less if the household:
- 17 (1) Is at or below one hundred fifty per cent of the
- 18 federal poverty level for the State;
- 19 (2) Has not previously received a lifetime total of
- 20 twenty-four months of public assistance;
- 21 (3) Is eliqible to receive child care assistance; and

1	(4)	has fulfilled the following work requirements for at
2		least one of the three months immediately preceding
3		entry in the program:
4		(A) One hundred twenty hours for a two-parent
5		household, whether by one or both parents;
6		(B) Sixty hours for a single-parent household; or
7		(C) Forty hours for a single-parent household while
8		the parent attends post-secondary education or
9		training.
10	(b)	The eligible parent shall:
11	(1)	Be at least eighteen years of age or have received a
12		high school diploma or its equivalent;
13	(2)	Care for the child full-time in the child's home; and
14	(3)	Care for any other children in the household who are
15		eligible for child care assistance.
16	<u>(c)</u>	The maximum rate of the subsidy shall be equal to the
17	rate esta	blished by the department for the care of a child age
18	two years	or less in state licensed family child care settings.
19	<u>(d)</u>	A participating household shall report any income and
20	other hou	sehold changes to the department.
21	<u>(e)</u>	Upon leaving the at-home infant child care program, a
22	person ma	y resume participation in any other public assistance

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1	programs in which the person was participating with the same	
2	status the person had prior to participating in the at-home	
3	infant child care program.	
4	(f) Household members may participate in education and	
5	work activities as long as one or both of the parents provide	
6	full-time, at-home child care for their child age two years or	
7	less.	
8	(g) The at-home infant child care program shall be	
9	implemented and funded through the department. The department	
10	shall:	
11	(1) Develop and distribute consumer information regarding	
12	the program to assist parents of children age two	
13	years or less, or expectant parents, in making	
14	informed child care decisions; and	
15	(2) Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 to implement	
16	this section.	
17	(h) For the purposes of this section, "parent" means a	
18	birth parent, adoptive parent, stepparent, foster parent, or	
19	legal guardian.	
20	(i) Assistance under this section shall not establish an	
21	employer-employee relationship between any member of the	
22	qualifying household and the State."	

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- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
- 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 5 2008-2009 for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 7 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
