

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's healthy 2 start program began as a child abuse prevention pilot project in 3 1985. It was expanded statewide in 2001 to prevent child abuse 4 and neglect, and to promote child health and development in 5 newborns of families at risk for poor child outcomes. At one 6 time, there was concern that certain families facing substance 7 abuse, domestic violence, and mental health issues were not being effectively enrolled in the program. As a result, a 8 9 multi-disciplinary team was established, known as enhanced healthy start, to serve families at threatened harm levels of 10 11 risk, as well as, infants and toddlers confirmed as being 12 subject to abuse or neglect. 13 The following additional program changes have been 14 recommended:
- 15 (1) Increase prenatal intake as a means of increasing
  16 engagement, retention, and effectiveness;

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1	(2)	Focus on risk factors identified on the Family Stress
2		Checklist at assessment;
3	(3)	Improve the ratio of child development specialists and
4		clinical specialists to the number of families served;
5		and
6	(4)	Develop training to keep providers abreast of state of
7		the art interventions.
8	The	purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
9	healthy s	tart program, including enhanced healthy start, to
10	address b	udgetary shortfalls and to implement recommended
11	improvements to the program.	
12	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,300,000, or so	
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and	
15	the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal	
16	year 2008-2009, for the healthy start program, including	
17	enhanced healthy start, the hiring of a child development	
18	specialist or clinical specialist, and provider training.	
19	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department	
20	of health	for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007. 1
