A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's healthy 2 start program began as a child abuse prevention pilot project in 3 1985. It was expanded statewide in 2001 to prevent child abuse 4 and neglect, and to promote child health and development in 5 newborns of families at risk for poor child outcomes. At one time, there was concern that certain families facing substance 6 7 abuse, domestic violence, and mental health issues were not being effectively enrolled in the program. As a result, a 8 9 multi-disciplinary team was established, known as enhanced
- 10 healthy start, to serve families at threatened harm levels of
- 11 risk, as well as, infants and toddlers confirmed as being
- 12 subject to abuse or neglect.
- 13 The following additional program changes have been
- 14 recommended:
- 15 (1) Increase prenatal intake as a means of increasing
- engagement, retention, and effectiveness;

- (2) Focus on risk factors identified on the Family Stress
 Checklist at assessment;
- 6 (4) Develop training to keep providers abreast of state of7 the art interventions.
- The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the healthy start program, including enhanced healthy start, to address budgetary shortfalls and to implement recommended improvements to the program.
- SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,300,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, for the healthy start program, including enhanced healthy start, the hiring of a child development
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of health for the purposes of this Act.
