### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOURISM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that tourism is the economic engine that drives the State's economy. Hawaii relies 2 3. greatly upon the revenues generated by tourism and the vibrant economic activity that it stimulates. The State is able to do 4 5 this in large part because it holds the competitive advantage of 6 being blessed with many natural attributes that make the islands 7 an attractive visitor destination. However, the visitor 8 industry is an extremely competitive one and the State, through 9 both the public and private sectors, needs to work to maintain 10 and enhance Hawaii's current competitive advantage. This means 11 not only maintaining current infrastructure, but also upgrading 12 and developing new infrastructure to create a visitor-friendly 13 environment. The Waikiki area on Oahu exemplifies both the attraction an area has for visitors and the need to maintain and 14 15 upgrade the visitor experience. 16 The purpose of this Act is to create a taskforce to investigate the development of a tourism economic district in an 17 18 area such as Waikiki in which the public and private sectors and

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         SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $ , or so much
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    thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for
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    purposes of this Act.
