A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE RULES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that although the internet website of the lieutenant governor contains links to 2 the existing administrative rules of all state agencies, as well 3 4 as links to proposed rule changes for each agency, the administrative rules and proposed rule changes are accessible 5 only as links to the internet website of each specific state 6 department or agency. Interested parties are unable to conduct 7 8 a full search of all administrative rules by entering a single query on the administrative rules section of the lieutenant 9 governor's internet website. Instead, the current linkage of 10 11 rules to the lieutenant governor's internet website allows for a 12 review of the administrative rules of only one state department or one state agency at a time. The legislature finds that 13 14 providing a single, searchable database that contains the full text of all existing administrative rules for all state agencies 15 16 would allow for more direct participation in government by our citizens. 17



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1	The purpose of this Act is to require the lieutenant
2	governor to post in a single, searchable database, the full text
3	of all existing administrative rules for all state agencies on
4	the lieutenant governor's internet website.
5	SECTION 2. Section 91-2.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"[[]§91-2.6[]] Proposed rulemaking actions [and] <u>;</u> rules;
8	adoption, amendment, or repeal; posting on the lieutenant
9	governor's [Internet] internet website. (a) Beginning January
10	1, [2000,] <u>2008,</u> all state agencies, through the office of the
11	lieutenant governor, shall make available on the internet
12	website of the office of the lieutenant governor <u>all rules of</u>
13	each agency, including the existing rules, each proposed
14	rulemaking action of the agency $[and]_{\underline{\prime}}$ the full text of the
15	agency's proposed rules or changes to existing rules. The
16	lieutenant governor's internet website shall include the full
17	text of all existing rules for each state agency in a single
18	database that allows the text of all rules to be searched by a
19	word or citation query and provide instructions regarding how to
20	download the information regarding proposed rulemaking actions
21	and the full text of the agency's proposed rules.

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Each state agency, to the greatest extent feasible, 1 (b) 2 shall: Ensure that all information pertaining to that agency 3 (1)that is contained on the lieutenant governor's website 4 is current and accurate; and 5 Advise individuals contacting the state agency of the (2) 6 availability of the proposed rulemaking actions and 7 the full text of the agency's proposed rules and 8 existing rules on the lieutenant governor's website. 9 (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit 10 the ability of a department to provide access to its 11 12 administrative rules on its own internet website, in addition to the lieutenant governor's website pursuant to subsection (a)." 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 15 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for 16 the development and implementation of a complete, up-to-date, 17 single, searchable database of the administrative rules of each 18 state agency available on the website of the office of the 19 20 lieutenant governor.

21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the22 lieutenant governor for the purposes of this Act.



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SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
