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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A BIOENERGY MASTER PLAN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that significant steps 2 were taken during the 2006 legislative session to move Hawaii 3 towards a more sustainable energy future: renewable energy tax 4 credits were increased and made permanent, programs for 5 renewable hydrogen and solar water heating were established, and energy efficiency measures are now required to be considered by 6 state agencies. A biofuel preference for state agencies was 7 also established as well as a mandate requiring twenty per cent 8 of highway fuels be comprised of alternate fuels by the year 9 10 2020.

11 The legislature also finds that Hawaii should further 12 diversify its energy system and reduce its dependence on 13 imported petroleum by introducing bioenergy resources into the 14 overall energy system.

In response to this desire to diversify Hawaii's energy system, a biofuels summit and a bioenergy workshop were held during 2006 to explore the potential for a domestic bioenergy

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and biofuels future. Both resulted in the realization that
 initiating a bioenergy industry in Hawaii must first address a
 diverse and very complex set of issues that involves many public
 and private stakeholders.

These two activities demonstrated the effectiveness of 5 6 facilitated collaboration and pointed to the value of a 7 mechanism to coordinate development of supply, production capability, and infrastructure, each with long independent lead 8 times, which is understood and supported by both public and 9 private stakeholders. Therefore, the legislature finds that the 10 preparation of a biofuels master plan is necessary to establish 11 12 a cohesive roadmap for the development of a bioenergy industry in Hawaii. 13

14 The purpose of this Act is to task the department of 15 business, economic development, and tourism with the development 16 and preparation of a bioenergy master plan for Hawaii. This 17 master plan will set the course for the coordination and 18 implementation of policies and procedures to develop a bioenergy 19 industry in Hawaii.

20 SECTION 2. (a) The department of business, economic
21 development, and tourism shall develop and prepare a bioenergy

18	(b)	The department of business, economic development, and
19	tourism shall submit an interim report of its progress,	
20	including	any proposed legislation to facilitate the
21	finalization of a master plan or support preliminary findings to	
22	accelerate the implementation of a bioenergy future for Hawaii,	
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1 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 2 convening of the regular session of 2008. The department shall 3 submit a final report, including the bioenergy master plan, as 4 well as any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later 5 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session 6 of 2009.

7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000, or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the 10 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 11 2008-2009.

12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 13 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes 14 of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
