A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR CLINICAL TRIAL UNITS FOR HIV AND AIDS IN HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the recent loss in

 federal funding from the National Institute of Health for

 clinical trial units for HIV and AIDS in Hawaii will have
- 4 devastating effects for the treatment of HIV and AIDS patients
- 5 in Hawaii, and will, for all practical purposes, end HIV and
- 6 AIDS clinical trials. Since the Hawaii AIDS clinical trials
- 7 unit was established fifteen years ago at the University of
- 8 Hawaii's John A. Burns School of Medicine, it has participated
- 9 in two hundred seventy-five drug studies that involved
- 10 approximately one thousand patients. The Hawaii AIDS clinical
- 11 trials unit has used its expertise to become an invaluable
- 12 resource for the medical community and a frontline healthcare
- 13 provider to HIV and AIDS patients across the State. The
- 14 legislature recognizes that there is a concern about the exodus
- 15 of physicians who treat HIV and AIDS patients. As those
- 16 physicians retire or leave the State, other physicians drop or
- 17 do not accept HIV and AIDS patients because of the complex care



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- 1 required and the low insurance reimbursement rates. Since the
- 2 overextended system does not provide for all HIV and AIDS
- 3 patients, physicians and AIDS service organizations have come to
- 4 rely on the Hawaii AIDS clinical trials unit, and there is no
- 5 other agency stepping in to fill the void the Hawaii AIDS
- 6 clinical trials unit will leave if it discontinues its work.
- 7 The legislature recognizes that the federal funds previously
- 8 received constitute two-thirds of the unit's funding and the
- 9 program cannot continue without the funds. More importantly,
- 10 given Hawaii's geographic location and the predictable lack of
- 11 potentially life-saving medications that are developed only in
- 12 clinical trials, HIV and AIDS patients in Hawaii will no longer
- 13 have access to potentially life-saving medication available
- 14 elsewhere in the country.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 16 funds for clinical trials units for HIV and AIDS patients in
- 17 Hawaii.
- 18 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
- 21 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

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- 1 year 2008-2009, to fund clinical trial units for HIV/AIDS
- 2 patients in Hawaii.
- 3 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated shall be expended by the
- 4 University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
