A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GREENBELTS.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by SECTION 1. 2 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 3 as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 **GREENBELTS** 6 -1 Purpose and intent. The department of Ş transportation, in conjunction with the department of land and 7 8 natural resources, shall develop a statewide greenbelts strategy 9 to promote identification or development of transportation 10 system management and alternatives to the automobile pursuant to 11 chapter 226, while preserving the natural resources and beauty 12 of the State. Greenbelts are corridors containing trails that link together parks and other scenic and historic attractions in 13 14 an area. 15 Current land planning fosters dependency on personal 16 automobiles by placing homes far from stores and jobs. 17 Therefore, approximately ninety per cent of personal travel in Hawaii is by private automobiles, which pollutes the air, clogs 18

1 highways, and wastes energy reserves. Typical suburban 2 development also sprawls over the countryside, destroying 3 Hawaii's natural beauty. 4 The State and the counties need to rethink their land use 5 policies to reduce dependency on the personal automobile and imported oil used for travel. New policies should promote mixed 6 use pedestrian-oriented communities around transit hubs that 7 blend reasonably-priced housing, work, and shopping areas and 8 create neighborhoods that encourage walking and biking. 9 10 Greenbelts: (1) Promote non-motorized transportation modes, such as 11 12 walking, jogging, hiking, bicycling, skating, and horseback riding; 13 14 (2) Create integrated ground transportation and 15 recreational systems; Benefit urban, suburban, and rural habitats; 16 (3) Create and enhance recreational activities and 17 (4)18 opportunities; 19 (5) Enhance visitor attractions and associated business 20 opportunities; 21 Can be built using federal funding available under the (6)

Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act; and

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- 1 (7) Provide a resource guideline for further acquisition
 2 of public, private, and government lands to be
 3 utilized for public recreation and non-motorized
 4 transit.
 5 -2 Definition. As used in this chapter:
 6 "Greenbelts" means a linear open space established along
 7 either a natural corridor, such as a stream or ridgeline, or
 - 9 Activities that are compatible with greenbelts include walking,

- "Steering committee" means the greenbelts strategy steering

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- 14 § -3 Development of a statewide greenbelts strategy.
- 15 The department of transportation shall develop a statewide
- 16 greenbelts strategy that incorporates existing and proposed non-
- 17 motorized transportation and recreational master plans for each
- 18 island.
- 19 § -4 Establishment of greenbelts steering committee.
- 20 The statewide greenbelts strategy shall be directed by a
- 21 greenbelts strategy steering committee, placed within the

2	objectives	of	the	steering	commit	tee	shall	inclu	ıde:		

- (1) Assessing existing and potential lands for beautification projects, corridors, and linkages to create greenbelts on each island. These include existing and former railway lines, trails, creek and river corridors, roadways, and other areas that are underutilized and could be converted to public recreational use;
 - (2) Gathering information on other greenbelts programs throughout the United States and the world;
 - (3) Facilitating the coordination of the planning and implementation of greenbelts with federal, state, and county agencies, businesses, and citizens;
 - (4) Facilitating the coordination of the planning of sustainable communities for the State;
 - (5) Examining funding strategies from public and private sources to continue the efforts of the steering committee and to implement various projects;
 - (6) Proposing ways to educate and inform government officials and the public on the many benefits of greenbelts;

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1	(7)	Establishing further goals and strategies to create
2		greenbelts in Hawaii, and setting priorities for their
3		implementation through the Oahu metropolitan planning
4		organization; and
5	(8)	Promoting the health, safety, and welfare of the
6		community by striving for a balance between motorized
7		and non-motorized transit systems.
8	\$	-5 Action plan. The steering committee shall develop
9	recommend	ations and establish an action plan containing details
10	for the f	urther development of a greenbelts strategy, including
11	proposed	timetables and budgets.
12	S	-6 Participation in the greenbelts strategy. The
13	steering	committee shall include the following members or their
14	designate	d representatives:
15	(1)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
16		resources;
17	(2)	The director of transportation;
18	(3)	The director of the office of planning;
19	(4)	The director of the agency responsible for
20		transportation from each county;
21	(5)	The director of the planning department from each
22		county;

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1	(6)	The chairperson of the University of Hawaii department
2		of urban and regional planning;
3	(7)	A representative of a citizen activist group from each
4		of the islands, appointed by the governor from a list
5		of nominees submitted by the respective mayors; and
6	(8)	A representative of a bicycle advocacy group appointed
7		by the governor.
8	\$	-7 Compensation. Members of the steering committee
9	shall ser	ve on a voluntary basis and shall not receive
10	compensat	ion."
11	SECT	ION 2. The steering committee shall submit its action
12	plan with	recommendations for the further development of a
13	greenbelt	s strategy to the legislature no later than twenty days
14	prior to	the convening of the regular session of 2008.
15	Inte	rested parties shall be afforded ample opportunity to
16	participa	te in the planning, development, and implementation of
17	the recom	mendations of the steering committee. The steering
18	committee	shall hold public meetings on all islands or, if not
19	feasible,	shall accept testimony and public opinion via the
20	state vid	eo conferencing center, in the development of its

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recommendations.

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SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
