A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEAHI HOSPITAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that providing health
- 2 care to the State's residents is critical and providing health
- 3 care education is a growing and necessary service in Hawaii
- 4 today. The John A. Burns school of medicine at the University
- 5 of Hawaii is particularly well-equipped and capable to furnish
- 6 the expertise needed to ensure that health care providers are
- 7 well-trained and equipped to handle the present and future needs
- 8 of our residents.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to remove Leahi hospital from
- 10 the Hawaii health systems corporation and establish the hospital
- 11 within the John A. Burns school of medicine at the University of
- 12 Hawaii. The legislature finds that the establishment of Leahi
- 13 hospital within the University of Hawaii is a matter of
- 14 statewide concern, and does not constitute an intrusion into the
- 15 exclusive jurisdictional powers of the board of regents of the
- 16 University of Hawaii.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§304A- Leahi hospital; established. There is		
5	established Leahi hospital within the John A. Burns school of		
6	medicine at the University of Hawaii, under the direction of a		
7	director who shall be appointed by the dean of the school of		
8	medicine, with the approval of the board of regents. Subject to		
9	the availability of funds, faculty, and facilities, Leahi		
10	hospital shall offer any courses of study that may be deemed		
11	appropriate and authorized by the board of regents. The		
12	hospital shall cooperate with other public and private entities		
13	and persons to promote and develop a professional medical		
14	workforce and to improve and enhance the State's health care		
15	base through education and training. Leahi hospital may:		
16	(1) Continue providing medical services currently provided		
17	to the community as deemed appropriate by the school		
18	of medicine;		
19	(2) Conduct and participate in medical and technical		
20	education and training for entry-level and higher-		
21	qualified students of the school of medicine and		
22	others, but shall not be limited to these students;

1	(3)	Provide facilities for medical and technical training	
2		for students of Kapiolani community college, but shall	
3		not be limited to these students;	
4	(4)	Conduct and promote research, conferences, and studies	
5		to improve the health care education process and laws,	
6		policies, methods, rules, procedures, and forms	
7		relating to health care; and	
8	(5)	Report on and make recommendations regarding goals,	
9		guidelines, innovations, and evaluations of state and	
10		county government health care initiatives."	
11	SECTION 3. Section 323F-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended by amending the definition of "health facility" to read		
13	as follows:		
14	""Health facility" means any one of the facilities that		
15	constitute the division of community hospitals $[-]$, excluding		
16	Leahi hospital."		
17	SECTION 4. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of		
18	Leahi hospital are transferred to the John A. Burns school of		
19	medicine at the University of Hawaii.		
20	All officers and employees whose functions are transferred		
21	by this A	ct shall be transferred with their functions and shall

    continue to perform their regular duties upon their transfer,
 2
    subject to the state personnel laws and this Act.

         No officer or employee of the State having tenure shall
 4
    suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit,
 5
    vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or privilege as
    a consequence of this Act, and such officer or employee may be
 6
    transferred or appointed to a civil service position without the
 7

    necessity of examination; provided that the officer or employee
    possesses the minimum qualifications for the position to which
 9

    transferred or appointed; and provided that subsequent changes

    in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and
12
    compensation laws.

         An officer or employee of the State who does not have
14
    tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil
15
    service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a
16
    civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority,
    prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee
17
    benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination;

    provided that such officer or employee possesses the minimum
    qualifications for the position to which transferred or

1 If an office or position held by an officer or employee 2 having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not 3 thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in 4 the employment of the State with the same pay and classification 5 and shall be transferred to some other office or position for which the officer or employee is eligible under the personnel 6 7 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or 8 the governor. 9 SECTION 5. All appropriations, records, equipment, 10 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, 11 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used, 12 acquired, or held by Leahi hospital relating to the functions 13 transferred to the John A. Burns school of medicine at the University of Hawaii shall be transferred with the functions to 14 15 which they relate. 16 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 17 and stricken.
