A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SMOKING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 328J-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending the definition of "open to the public" to 3 read as follows: 4 ""Open to the public" means enclosed or partially enclosed 5 areas to which the public is invited or permitted and areas 6 within any building available for use by or accessible to the 7 general public during the normal course of business conducted 8 therein by either private or public entities, including but not 9 limited to [bars,] educational facilities, financial 10 institutions, health care facilities, hotel and motel lobbies, 11 lanais, laundromats, public transportation facilities, including 12 airport areas from curb to cabin and including all areas within 13 and immediately in front of and adjacent to passenger terminals 14 and pick-up areas, throughout the airport facility, and up to 15 the passenger loading gates of all state airports, reception 16 areas, [restaurants,] retail food production and marketing establishments, retail service establishments, retail stores, **17** shopping malls, sports arenas, theaters, and waiting rooms, but 18



1 does not include a private residence unless it is used as a 2 child care, adult day care, or health care facility." SECTION 2. Section 328J-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "[+]§328J-3[+] Prohibition in enclosed or partially 6 enclosed places open to the public. Smoking shall be prohibited in all enclosed or partially enclosed areas open to the public, 7 8 including but not limited to the following places: Airports and public transportation facilities and 9 (1)vehicles, including buses and taxicabs, under the 10 authority of the State or county, and ticket, 11 12 boarding, and waiting areas of public transit depots, 13 including airports from curb to cabin and including all areas within and immediately in front of and 14 15 adjacent to passenger terminals and pick-up areas, 16 throughout the airport facility, and up to the 17 passenger loading gates of all state airports; 18 (2)Aquariums, galleries, libraries, and museums; Areas available to and customarily used by the general 19 (3) 20 public, including but not limited to restrooms, 21 lobbies, reception areas, hallways, and other common 22 areas, in businesses and nonprofit entities patronized

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                professional offices, banks, laundromats, hotels, and

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          (5)] (4) Bowling alleys;
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         [\frac{(6)}{(6)}] (5) Convention facilities;
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         [\frac{(7)}{1}] (6) Educational facilities, both public and private;
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         \left[\frac{(8)}{(7)}\right] (7) Elevators;
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          [\frac{(9)}{}] (8) Facilities primarily used for exhibiting a motion
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                picture, stage, drama, lecture, musical recital, or
                other similar performance, except when part of the
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                performance;
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        [\frac{(10)}{(10)}] (9) Health care facilities;
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        \left[\frac{(11)}{(11)}\right] (10) Hotel and motel lobbies, meeting rooms, and
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                banquet facilities;
        [\frac{(12)}{(11)}] (11) Licensed child care and adult day care
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                facilities;
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        [\frac{(13)}{(12)}] Lobbies, hallways, and other common areas in
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                apartment buildings, condominiums, retirement
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                facilities, nursing homes, multifamily dwellings, and
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                other multiple-unit residential facilities;
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        (14) Nightclubs;
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        \frac{(15)}{(13)}] (13) Polling places;
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        (16) Restaurants;
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        \frac{(17)}{(14)}] (14) Retail stores;
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        [\frac{(18)}{(15)}] (15) Rooms, chambers, places of meeting or public
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               assembly under the control of an agency, board,
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               commission, committee or council of the State or
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               county, to the extent the place is subject to the
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               jurisdiction of the State or county;
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        [\frac{(19)}{(16)}] (16) Service lines; and
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        \left[\frac{(20)}{(17)}\right] (17) Shopping malls."
          SECTION 3. Section 328J-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
          "[+]$328J-7[+] Exceptions. Notwithstanding any other
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    provision of this chapter to the contrary, the following areas
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    shall be exempt from the provisions of sections 328J-3, 328J-4,
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    and 328J-5:
               Private residences, except when used as a licensed
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          (1)
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               child care, adult day care, or health care facility;
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          (2) Hotel and motel rooms that are rented to quests and
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               are designated as smoking rooms; provided that not
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               more than twenty per cent of rooms rented to guests in
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               a hotel or motel may be so designated. All smoking
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1		rooms on the same floor shall be contiguous and smoke
2		from these rooms shall not infiltrate into areas where
3		smoking is prohibited under this chapter. The status
4		of rooms as smoking or nonsmoking may not be changed,
5		except to add additional nonsmoking rooms;
6	(3)	Retail tobacco stores; provided that smoke from these
7		places shall not infiltrate into areas where smoking
8		is prohibited under this chapter;
9	(4)	Private and semiprivate rooms in nursing homes and
10		long-term care facilities that are occupied by one or
11		more persons, all of whom are smokers and have
12		requested in writing to be placed in a room where
13		smoking is permitted; provided that smoke from these
14		places shall not infiltrate into areas where smoking
15		is prohibited under this chapter;
16	(5)	Outdoor areas of places of employment except those
17		covered by the provisions of sections 328J-3 and
18		328J-5;
19	(6)	All areas covered by this chapter when smoking is part
20		of a production being filmed; [and]
21	(7)	Bars, nightclubs, and restaurants; provided that a
22		clearly legible sign with letters of not less than one

1	inch in height is displayed outside the premises
2	warning the public that the establishment permits
3	smoking within the premises; and
4	[(7)] <u>(8)</u> State correctional facilities."
5	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
