A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATED TO THEFT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the theft of copper 2 wires from State parks and highways is a growing problem that, 3 if not corralled, can grow into a potentially difficult problem 4 to deal with. 5 The legislature finds that this kind of theft results in millions of dollars of loss throughout the United States. 6 7 The purpose of this Act is to deter the theft of copper 8 wires and other valuable resources by increasing the severity of 9 the consequences. 10 SECTION 2. Section 708-831, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "§708-831 Theft in the second degree. (1) A person 13 commits the offense of theft in the second degree if the person 14 commits theft: Of property from the person of another; 15 (a) 16 Of property or services the value of which exceeds (b)

2	(2)	Theft in the second degree is a class C felony. A
3	person co	nvicted of committing the offense of theft in the
4	second de	gree under [subsection (1)] $\frac{(c)}{(c)}$ and $\frac{(d)}{(c)}$ $\frac{(c,)}{(d)}$, and
5	(e) shall	be sentenced in accordance with chapter 706, except
6	that for	the first offense, the court may impose a minimum
7	sentence	of a fine of at least \$1,000 or two-fold damages
8	sustained	by the victim, whichever is greater.
9	(3)	For the purpose of this section:
10		"Highway" means any road, highway, or the like that is
11		regulated, governed, or maintained by the State of
12		Hawaii or any of its political subdivisions.
13		"Public Park" means any park that is regulated,
14		governed, or maintained by the State of Hawaii or any
15		of its political subdivisions.
16		"Wiring" means usually pliable metallic strand or rod
17		sometimes clad, and often electrically insulated, used
18		chiefly for structural support or to conduct
19		electricity inside, apart of, or used to be a part of
20		any type of thing.
