## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAREGIVING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The joint legislative committee on family
2	caregiving (committee) was established under Act 285, Session
3	Laws of Hawaii 2006 (Act 285), to develop a comprehensive public
4	policy to strengthen support for family caregivers in Hawaii.
5	Once all of the members of the committee were appointed,
6	the committee held several meetings during the fall of 2006.
7	The objectives of these meetings were to address and meet the
8	requirements of Act 285 by developing and adopting a policy that
9	provides support and services for family caregivers who care for
10	individuals over the age of sixty with physical or cognitive
11	disabilities. Based on these objectives, the committee
12	submitted a special committee report to the legislature
13	outlining its process for developing a policy to establish a
14	comprehensive and sustainable, community-based family caregiver
15	support system that will maximize resources in all communities.
16	In its recommendations, the committee noted that after
17	reviewing the magnitude of creating a comprehensive family

- 1 caregiver support system, more time is required to perform
- 2 research and community outreach and establish pilot programs.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 4 (1) Extend the life of the joint legislative committee on family caregiving;
- 6 (2) Authorize the joint legislative committee to explore
  7 establishing a paid family leave program under the
  8 State's temporary disability insurance law; and
- 9 (3) Provide a broader definition for "family caregiver".
- 10 SECTION 2. Act 285, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is
- 11 amended by amending section 2 to read as follows:
- "SECTION 2. (a) There is established a joint legislative
- 13 committee on family caregiving. The committee shall be composed
- 14 of eight members as follows:
- 15 (1) Four members of the house of representatives,
- 16 consisting of three members from the majority party
- and one member from the minority party, who shall be
- 18 appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 19 representatives; and
- 20 (2) Four members of the senate, consisting of three
- 21 members from the majority party and one member from

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               the minority party, who shall be appointed by the
               president of the senate.

          The committee shall select a chairperson from its
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    membership.

               The joint legislative committee shall develop
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    comprehensive public policy to strengthen support for family
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    caregivers who provide unpaid, informal assistance to persons
    age sixty and older with physical or cognitive disabilities.
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    For purposes of this Act, "family caregivers" includes persons
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    with no blood relationship to the care recipient, and
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    grandparents who are caregivers for their grandchildren who are
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    age eighteen years or younger and have physical or cognitive
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    disabilities.
