A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the United States
- 2 Army's 68th Medical Company's Medical Assistance to Safety and
- 3 Traffic helicopters have served Hawaii for more than thirty
- 4 years. These military aeromedical helicopters have transported
- 5 over seven thousand patients and saved countless lives by
- 6 transporting patients from rural areas, particularly in West
- 7 Oahu and the North Shore of Oahu to hospitals located in
- 8 Honolulu. However, due to the increased military activity
- 9 particularly in Afghanistan and Iraq, the aeromedical
- 10 helicopters have been deployed. The legislature further finds
- 11 that subsequently, the Hawaii Army national guard helicopter
- 12 unit has been providing emergency medevac transportation on
- 13 Oahu, but that this unit has received a warning order for a
- 14 likely deployment to Iraq. The legislature recognizes that the
- 15 free medevac services provided by the Hawaii Army national guard
- 16 helicopter unit have not been extended beyond December 31, 2006.
- 17 This leaves rural Oahu residents without aeromedical services.

    necessary for the health and safety of residents and therefore

         It is not the intent of this Act to supplant existing

    shall be based on national aeromedical triage and transport
