A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SHARK FEEDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 188-40.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 4 "(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), or as otherwise
- 5 provided by law, it shall be unlawful for any person to conduct
- 6 any commercial activity anywhere in the state or in state waters
- 7 related to the feeding of sharks in state marine waters."
- 8 2. By amending subsection (e) to read:
- 9 "(e) As used in this section:
- 10 "Commercial activity" means to engage in any action or to
- 11 attempt to engage in any action for compensation in any form.
- 12 The action or actions may include, but are not limited to,
- 13 soliciting, advertising, providing, or attempting to provide,
- 14 quide services, charters, tours, and transportation to and from
- 15 the location or locations for which such services are provided.
- 16 "Compensation" means money, barter, trade, credit, and
- 17 other instruments of value, goods, and other forms of payment.

- 1 "Feeding" means the introduction of or an attempt to
- 2 introduce any food or other substance into the water to attract
- 3 marine life for any purpose other than to take the marine life."
- 4 SECTION 2. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 5 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 6 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 7 applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the
- 8 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 9 of this Act are severable.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun, before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
