### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CEMETERIES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 441-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

3	The map or plat shall also be filed in the office of the		
4	bureau of conveyances or the office of the assistant registrar		
5	of the land court. that uniquely identify each niche or crypt;

7	(3) File the maps or plats required by this section in the		
8	office of the bureau of conveyances or the office of		
9	the assistant registrar of the land court, and		
10	maintain a copy of all filed maps as a permanent		
11	record of the cemetery authority.		
12	(b) The cemetery authority shall maintain a permanent,		
13	accurate record of the identity of each person whose remains are		
14	located in the cemetery, together with the corresponding unique		
15	identifier that indicates the location of the person's remains		
16	within the cemetery. The records required by this section shall		
17	be prepared and maintained in a manner that will enable the		
18	cemetery authority to respond timely to inquiries from the		
19	public or the department regarding the location of a person's		
20	remains within the cemetery.		
21	(c) The cemetery authority shall specify the unique		
22	identifier of a plot, crypt, or niche in any document that

    provides for the sale, transfer, or disposition of the plot,
2
    crypt, or niche."
         SECTION 2. Section 441-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    amended to read as follows:
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         "§441-13 Sale of plots after dedication; sale of
    incumbered plots prohibited unless incumbrance subordinate to
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    dedication. After property is dedicated pursuant to this

    chapter, a cemetery authority may sell, transfer, and convey
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    plots, crypts, or niches thereof, which plots, crypts, or niches
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    [may] shall be described by reference to the map or plat, or
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    amended map or plat, filed in accordance with section 441-3 or
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    441-8. No plot, crypt, or niche shall be sold, transferred,
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    conveyed, or otherwise disposed of, or offered for sale,
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    transfer, conveyance, or other disposition, unless the property
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    on or in which the plot, crypt, or niche is included has been
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    dedicated pursuant to this chapter, nor shall any plot, crypt,
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    or niche be sold, transferred, conveyed, or otherwise disposed
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    of, or offered for sale, transfer, conveyance, or other
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    disposition, unless the property on or in which the plot, crypt,
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    or niche is included shall either be free and clear of all
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    incumbrances or there has been recorded the written consent of

    every incumbrancer thereof that the incumbrancer's incumbrance
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1	shall be	subject and subordinate to the dedication of the
2	property	to cemetery purposes and the title of any plot, crypt,
3	or niche	owner."
4	SECT	ION 3. Section 441-22.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
6	"(b)	Every cemetery or pre-need funeral authority shall be
7	required	to provide to the purchaser of cemetery property, pre-
8	need inte	rment, or pre-need funeral services and related
9	commoditi	es a written contract [which] shall [contain] make the
10	following	[disclosure requirements:] disclosures:
11	(1)	The names and addresses of the authority and
12		purchaser;
13	(2)	A clear and concise statement of the property,
14		including, for cemetery property, the location of the
15		plot, crypt, or niche by its unique identifier, and of
16		$\underline{\text{any}}$ services $[\tau]$ and related commodities to be supplied
17		or not supplied $\underline{\hspace{0.1in}}$ and by whom, particularly if the
18		authority is not to be the provider under the terms of
19		the contract;
20	(3)	The purchase price of each item of property, services,
21		and related commodities to be supplied and how the
22		purchase price is payable; provided that, pursuant to

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1		section 441-22.7, disclosure shall also be made that
2		further additional charges or fees for perpetual care
3		subsequent to the execution of the contract are
4		prohibited for any purpose and on any occasion, except
5		for reasonable fees related to the administrative
6		costs of transferring ownership rights, including the
7		cost of research, document and file preparation,
8		photocopying, notary fees, records transfer and
9		storage, and any other costs directly related to the
10		transfer of ownership rights;
11	(4)	Related costs covered under the contract;
12	(5)	The basis on which funds are to be deposited in trust;
13	(6)	Refund provisions of the contract;
14	(7)	The date and place of execution of the contract;
15	(8)	The authority's or its duly authorized agent's
16		signature on the contract and the identification of
17		this person by name and title; and
18	(9)	A statement that the written contract, when signed,
19		shall constitute the entire agreement between the
20		parties relative to its subject matter and that all
21		obligations of both parties shall be fixed and

1 enforceable by the other parties [of] to the contract." 2 SECTION 4. Section 441-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 5 Inspection of cemetery or pre-need funeral authority books[; annual exhibits]. The books, records, and 6 7 papers of every cemetery authority whether or not a corporation, which operates or claims to operate a perpetual care cemetery, 8 9 and of every pre-need funeral authority shall be subject to 10 examination by the director [to the same extent and in the same 11 manner as may be from time to time provided for corporations in 12 section 414-472, as provided by law, and every cemetery 13 authority operating a perpetual care cemetery, and every pre-14 need funeral authority shall submit such information as may be 15 required by the director in order to furnish information as to whether or not the cemetery or pre-need funeral authority has 16 17 complied with this chapter." 18 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 20 This Act shall take effect upon its approval. SECTION 6.

Cemeteries; Deceased Location and Identification

### Description:

Requires a cemetery authority to file with the department of commerce and consumer affairs a map of the cemetery, and a unique locating identifier that becomes a part of the contract disclosure requirements. Makes authority's books subject to examination by the department of commerce and consumer affairs.
