BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

6	SECTION 2. Section 448E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
7	amended to read as follows:

9	be examined and shall pass an examination to be eligible for			
10	licensure. The board shall provide in its rules the passing			
11	score for the examination. The board may examine applicants or			
12	may contract with professional testing services to prepare,			
13	administer, and grade the examination as may be required for the			
14	purpose of this section.			
15	(b) Every applicant shall pay an examination fee as			
16	provided in rules adopted by the director pursuant to chapter			
17	91. Should the board contract with a professional testing

This Act does not affect rights and duties that 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 9 begun, before its effective date. 10 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
