A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUILDING CODES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to promote the 2 health, safety, and welfare of the occupants or users of 3 buildings and structures and the general public through the 4 adoption of a uniform statewide model building code. 5 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 6 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 7 as follows: 8 "CHAPTER 9 STATEWIDE MODEL BUILDING CODE AND DESIGN STANDARDS 10 -1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to promote 11 the health, safety, and welfare of the occupants or users of 12 buildings and structures and the general public through the 13 adoption of a statewide model building code and design 14 standards. § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, the 15 16 following terms have the following meanings, unless the context 17 clearly requires otherwise:
- "Council" means the state building code council.

4	§ •	-3 State building code; establishment. (a) The
5	department	t of accounting and general services shall adopt rules
6	pursuant t	to chapter 91 to establish a building code for state
7	building o	construction.
8	(b)	The design of all state building construction shall be
9	in complia	ance with the state building code within one year of
10	its effect	tive date.
11	(c)	The state building code shall include the latest
12	edition of	f:
13	(1)	The International Building Code, published by the
14		International Code Council; and
15	(2)	Hawaii design standards implementing the criteria
16		developed by the department of defense pursuant to Act
17		5, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, applicable to
18		emergency shelters built to comply with hurricane
19		resistant criteria including enhanced hurricane
20		protection areas capable of withstanding a five
21		hundred-year hurricane event, and essential government
22		facilities requiring continuity of operations; and

1	(3)	Code provisions based on nationally published codes or
2		standards that include but are not limited to
3		residential and hurricane resistive standards for one-
4		and two-family residential construction, fire,
5		elevator, electrical, plumbing, mechanical, energy
6		conservation standards for building design and
7		construction, and private sewage disposal.
8	\$	-4 State building code council. (a) There is hereby
9	establish	ed a state building code council. The council shall be
10	placed fo	r administrative purposes in the department of
11	accountin	g and general services.
12	(b)	The council shall consist of nine voting members and
13	one nonvo	ting member. The members shall include:
14	(1)	One county building official from each of the four
15		counties;
16	(2)	One member representing the state fire council;
17	(3)	One member representing the department of health who
18		has significant experience in building mechanical and
19		sewage disposal systems;
20	(4)	One member representing the department of labor and
21		industrial relations who has significant experience in
22		fire safety;

1	(5)	One member representing the Structural Engineers
2		Association of Hawaii;
3	(6)	One member representing the American Institute of
4		Architects, Hawaii State Chapter; and
5	(7)	The comptroller or the comptroller's designated
6		representative who shall be a nonvoting member.
7	(c)	Members shall serve without compensation but shall be
8	reimburse	d for actual expenses, including travel expenses,
9	necessary	for the performance of their duties.
10	(d)	The chairperson of the council shall be elected
11	annually	from among its members by a majority vote of the
12	members o	f the council.
13	\$	-5 Executive director and executive assistant. (a)
14	The counc	il shall select an executive director, who shall serve
15	at the plo	easure of the council, and who shall have
16	administra	ative abilities and expertise in engineering or
17	architect	ure.
18	(b)	The council or the executive director shall select an
19	executive	assistant, who shall have experience in statutory and
20	administra	ative rulemaking processes.

-6 Duties of the council. Any law to the contrary

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notwithstanding, the council shall:

1	(1)	Establish a comprehensive state building code;
2	(2)	Appoint a subcommittee comprised solely of each of the
3		council members holding the county building official
4		seats, whose duty shall be to recommend any necessary
5		or desirable state amendments to the model codes. Any
6		recommended state amendments shall require the
7		unanimous agreement of the subcommittee;
8	(3)	The council shall review and adopt, as appropriate,
9		new model building codes within eighteen months of
10		their official published date; and
11	(4)	The council shall provide education and technical
12		training and administrative assistance in the form of
13		services or grants at the State and county levels
14		relating to the implementation and enforcement of the
15		state building code and county building codes adopted
16		pursuant to this chapter.
17	S	-7 General authority. The state building code council
18	may:	
19	(1)	Appoint other investigative technical expertise
20		committees which may include council members; and
21	(2)	Expend money for technical references, equipment,
22		supplies, and other operating expenses; and

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1 (3) Contract for the conduct of research studies and
2 provision of technical services.
3 § -8 Prohibitions. The council shall not adopt

provisions of the state building code that:

- (1) Relate to administrative, permitting, enforcement, andinspection procedures of each county; and
- 7 (2) Prohibit indigenous pre-western contact Hawaiian8 architecture.
- 9 § -9 Exemptions. Upon adoption of rules under this
 10 chapter, the State shall be exempted from county building codes
 11 for state building construction.
- § -10 Annual report. The department of accounting and general services shall submit an annual report to the legislature no less than twenty days prior to the commencement of the regular session. The report shall detail the activities and accomplishments of the council.
- § -11 County authority to amend. The governing body of
 each county is authorized to amend the state building code as it
 applies within that jurisdiction, in accordance with section
 46-1.5(13), without approval of the council, no later than two
 years after the adoption of the state building code. Each
 county shall use the model codes and standards listed in section
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- 1 -3, as the referenced model building codes and standards for
- 2 its county building code ordinance.
- 3 (b) County amendments shall be consistent with the minimum
- 4 performance standards of the state building code and the
- 5 objectives enumerated in section -1.
- 6 (c) If the counties do not amend the statewide model codes
- 7 within the two-year timeframe pursuant to subsection (a), the
- 8 state building code shall become applicable as an interim county
- 9 building code until the time that the county adopts its
- 10 amendments."
- 11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000, or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for
- 14 operations of the state building code council.
- 15 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000, or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 18 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 19 2008-2009, for technical assistance services to the state
- 20 building code council.
- 21 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 22 of accounting and general services.

SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties t	that
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- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun, before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
