### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUILDING CODES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	STATEWIDE MODEL BUILDING CODE AND DESIGN STANDARDS
6	§ -1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to promote
7	the health, safety, and welfare of the occupants or users of
8	buildings and structures and the general public through the
9	adoption of a statewide model building code and design
10	standards.
11	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, the
12	following terms have the following meanings, unless the context
13	clearly requires otherwise:
14	"Council" means the state building code council.
15	"State building code" means the uniform statewide model
16	building code.

1	"Sta	te building construction" means any building
2	construct	ion project or program initiated by a state agency or
3	requiring	the use of state funds.
4	S	-3 State building code; establishment. (a) There is
5	establish	ed a state building code applicable to all construction
6	in the St	ate of Hawaii.
7	(b)	The state building code shall include the latest
8	edition o	f:
9	(1)	The International Building Code, published by the
10		International Code Council;
11	(2)	The latest edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code, as
12		copyrighted and published by the International
13		Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials,
14		including its appendices;
15	(3)	Hawaii design standards implementing the criteria
16		developed by the department of defense pursuant to Act
17		5, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, applicable to
18		emergency shelters built to comply with hurricane
19		resistant criteria, including enhanced hurricane
20		protection areas capable of withstanding a five-
21		hundred-year hurricane event, as well as other storms
22		and natural hazards, and standards for essential

1		government facilities requiring continuity of
2		operations; and
3	(4)	Code provisions based on nationally published codes or
4		standards that include but are not limited to
5		residential and hurricane resistive standards for one-
6		and two-family residential construction, and fire,
7		elevator, electrical, plumbing, mechanical, and energy
8		conservation standards for building design and
9		construction, and private sewage disposal.
10	(c)	The department of accounting and general services
11	shall ado	pt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to establish a
12	temporary	building code for state building construction.
13	(d)	The design of all state building construction shall be
14	in compli	ance with the state building code within one year of
15	its effec	tive date.
16	§	-4 State building code council. (a) There is
17	establish	ed a state building code council. The council shall be
18	placed fo	r administrative purposes in the department of
19	accountin	g and general services.
20	(h)	The council shall consist of nine voting members and

one nonvoting member. The members shall include:

1	(1)	One county building official from each of the four
2		counties;
3	(2)	One member representing the state fire council;
4	(3)	One member representing the department of health who
5		has significant experience in building mechanical and
6		sewage disposal systems;
7	(4)	One member representing the department of labor and
8		industrial relations who has significant experience in
9		elevator or fire safety;
10	(5)	One member representing the Structural Engineers
11		Association of Hawaii;
12	(6)	One member representing the American Institute of
13		Architects, Hawaii State Council; and

16	(c)	Members shall serve without compensation but shall be

1	§ -5 Executive director and executive assistant. (a)
2	The council shall select an executive director, who shall serve
3	at the pleasure of the council, and who shall have
4	administrative abilities and expertise in engineering or
5	architecture.
6	(b) The council or the executive director shall select an
7	executive assistant, who shall have experience in statutory and
8	administrative rulemaking processes.
9	(c) The positions of executive director and executive
10	assistant shall not be subject to chapter 76. The compensation
11	of the executive director and executive assistant shall be
12	determined by the council.
13	§ -6 Duties of the council. Any law to the contrary
14	notwithstanding, the council shall:
15	(1) Establish a comprehensive state building code;
16	(2) Appoint a subcommittee comprised solely of each of the
17	council members holding the county building official
18	seats, whose duty shall be to recommend any necessary
19	or desirable State amendments to the model codes. Any
20	recommended State amendments shall require the

unanimous agreement of the subcommittee;

- 1 § -11 County authority to amend. (a) The governing
- 2 body of each county is authorized to amend the state building
- 3 code as it applies within that jurisdiction, in accordance with
- 4 section 46-1.5(13), without approval of the council, no later
- 5 than two years after the adoption of the state building code.
- 6 Each county shall use the model codes and standards listed in
- 7 section -3 as the referenced model building codes and
- 8 standards for its county building code ordinance.
- 9 (b) County amendments shall be consistent with the minimum
- 10 performance standards of the state building code and the
- 11 objectives enumerated in section -1.
- (c) If the counties do not amend the statewide model codes
- 13 within the two-year timeframe pursuant to subsection (a), the
- 14 state building code shall become applicable as an interim county
- 15 building code until the time that the county adopts its
- 16 amendments."
- 17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 19 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for the
- 20 operations of the state building code council.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 22 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
- 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 5 2008-2009 for technical assistance services to the state
- 6 building code council.
- 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 8 of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun, before its effective date.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
