## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCRAP COPPER DEALERS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 445, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to part X to be appropriately
- 3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "<u>\$445-</u> Prohibitions for copper transactions; penalties.

7	(b) Where a transaction involves scrap copper, a scrap

10	(1)	Both the seller's business and residence address;			
11	(2)	The seller's phone number;			
12	(3)	The seller's driver's license number, or the number of			
13		another identification tendered by the seller to

15	(4)	A photostatic copy of the seller's driver's license or			
16		other identification meeting the requirements of

18	(5)	In the absence of the license number of the vehicle			
19		used to deliver the copper to the place of purchase, a

22	(6)	A notarized statement from the seller's employer that:			



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1	<u>(A)</u>	Includes the employer's name, phone number, and

3	<u>(B)</u>	Describes the source of the copper; and	
4	<u>(C)</u>	States that the sale of copper wire is work-	
5		related; or if the sale of copper is not work-	
6		related, a signed, written statement describing	
7		how and where the seller obtained the copper.	
8	A scrap metal	dealer shall keep at the dealer's place of	
9	business, reco	rds of all statements and information required	
10	under this sec	tion for transactions involving copper, for four	
11	years after th	e date of purchase. A scrap metal dealer shall	
12	have the duty to take reasonable precautions to protect the		
13	privacy of those records. The records shall be made available		
14	to and may be examined at any time by the treasurer or the chief		
15	of police."		
16	SECTION 2	. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
17	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
18	begun, before its effective date.		
19	SECTION 3	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
20	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.

#### Report Title:

Scrap Copper Dealers; Recordkeeping; Prohibitions

### Description:

Prohibits scrap copper dealers from purchasing copper from minors and persons without a government-issued picture ID. Imposes additional recordkeeping requirements for scrap copper transactions. Requires records to be kept and made available to the counties and county police for four years.
