HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO DEVELOP AN ACTION PLAN TO DISSEMINATE INFORMATION TO PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES ON ACCESS TO COMPREHENSIVE VISION AND HEARING EXAMINATIONS.

WHEREAS, many visual skills are necessary for successful 1 learning in the modern classroom and skill deficiencies in this 2 area may contribute to poor academic performance; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the relationship between poorly developed visual 5 skills and poor academic performance is not widely understood 6 among students, parents, teachers, administrators, and public 7 health officials; and 8 9 WHEREAS, typical vision evaluations and screenings only 10 test for a few of the necessary learning-related visual skills 11 such as distance acuity (i.e., 20/20 eyesight, stereo vision, 12 and muscle balance), which leaves most visual skill deficiencies 13 undiagnosed; and 14 15 WHEREAS, children with mild hearing impairment to profound 16 hearing loss, as well as young students with central auditory 17 processing deficiencies, often experience extreme learning 18 difficulty in their educational environment; and 19 20 WHEREAS, early identification of hearing impairment or 21 hearing loss has been shown to increase access to the spoken 22 language and has allowed more children to enter the mainstream 23 of education; and 24 25 WHEREAS, forty per cent of children with hearing loss have 26 additional disorders such as impaired cognition, learning 27 disabilities, and sensory integration dysfunction -- behaviors 28 that are frequently overlooked by parents, educators, 29 physicians, and speech-language pathologists; and 30

1 2 WHEREAS, the Department of Education does not require vision or hearing examinations for students entering the public 3 school system; and 4 5 WHEREAS, with the demands of the No Child Left Behind Act, 6 7 a heavy burden is placed on teachers and administrators to effectively educate students with undiagnosed vision and hearing 8 9 deficits; and 10 WHEREAS, section 321-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 11 establishes a systematic hearing and vision program conducted by 12 the Department of Health to detect and identify hearing and 13 vision deficiencies in school children; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Department of Health and the Department of 16 Education are authorized, as part of the systematic hearing and 17 vision program, to conduct information campaigns on vision 18 conservation and the prevention of hearing loss and blindness; 19 20 and 21 22 WHEREAS, because funding has not been made available to the program, the Legislature is interested in the short- and long-23 term costs of not conducting the systematic hearing and vision 24 25 program; now, therefore, 26 BE IT RESOLVED that the Department of Health and the 27 Department of Education are requested to develop an action plan 28 to disseminate information to public school students and their 29 30 families on access to comprehensive vision and hearing examinations; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the 34 Director of Health, the Chairperson of the Board of Education, 35 and the Superintendent of Education. 36 37 38 39
