## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO INVESTIGATE AND COORDINATE THE PROVISION OF MEDICAL AND SOCIAL SERVICES TO MIGRANTS FROM FREELY ASSOCIATED STATES.

WHEREAS, The Compact of Free Association defines the 1 relationship that the Federated States of Micronesia, the 2 Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau have 3 as associated states with the United States; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, under the Compact, the United States provides direct economic assistance, federal services, and military 7 protection to the associated states in exchange for defense 8 9 rights; and 10 WHEREAS, under the Compact of Free Association, Freely 11 Associated States citizens can migrate in and out of Hawaii 12 without visas or other immigration requirements; and 13 14 WHEREAS, it is estimated that over eight thousand Freely 15 Associated States citizens have migrated to Hawaii; and 16 17 WHEREAS, this migration has had a significant financial 18 impact on Hawaii in terms of un-reimbursed health care, 19 education, public safety, and welfare costs; and 20 21 WHEREAS, since the federal government discontinued federal 22 medical and welfare assistance to Freely Associated States 23 citizens who migrated to Hawaii and other parts of the United 24 States, many rely on state aid; and 25 26 WHEREAS, it is reported that the health care and education 27 cost of migrants from the Freely Associated States to Hawaii 28 alone was \$86,000,000 between 1996 and 2000; and 29 30
