HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ADOPT ADMINISTRATIVE RULES TO INCLUDE CATCHMENT WATER SYSTEMS WITHIN ITS REGULATORY FRAMEWORK.

WHEREAS, United State Department of Agriculture Rural 1 Development Loan Program is committed to helping improve the 2 economy and guality of life in all of rural America; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Rural Development Loan Program provides 5 6 section 502 loans, which are primarily used to help low-income individuals or households purchase homes in rural areas that are 7 modest in size, design, and cost, but the funds can also be used 8 for construction, repair, renovation, or relocation of a home; 9 and 10 11 WHEREAS, an applicant for the thirty year loan may have an 12 income of up to one hundred fifteen per cent of the median 13 14 income for the area the applicant resides in; and 15 WHEREAS, under title 7, section 1980.313(c), Code of 16 Federal Regulations, the tract of land for which a loan is to 17 made must be served by a water and wastewater disposal system 18 that is approved by a state or local government agency; and 19 20 WHEREAS, except for the City of Hilo, all of the land in 21 the County of Hawaii is considered rural, where there is an 22 extreme shortage of affordable housing units to serve households 23 that may consist of elderly or disabled individuals, or single-24 parent families; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, individuals and families living in Puna and Ka`u, and other outlying areas, rely on catchment water systems to 28 store and provide water for their daily personal and household 29 needs because they are unable to enjoy the benefits from being 30 piped into municipal water systems due to their rural location; 31 and 32



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1 WHEREAS, although they live in rural areas and could 2 benefit from applying for and obtaining section 502 loans from 3 the Rural Development Loan Program, these individuals and 4 families do not qualify for this type of loan because the area 5 in which they live is not piped into a water system that is 6 approved by a state or local government agency, as required 7 under title 7, section 1980.313(c), Code of Federal Regulations; 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS, existing administrative rules adopted by the 11 Department of Health under title 11, Hawaii Administrative 12 13 Rules, and regulations adopted by the County of Hawaii Department of Water Supply do not apply to or regulate catchment 14 water systems, like those used in Puna and Ka`u; and 15 16 WHEREAS, under section 321-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the 17 Department of Health is authorized to adopt rules pursuant to 18 19 chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes to carry out the purposes, objectives, and duties of the Department; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the adoption of administrative rules to include 22 catchment water systems that serve and provide water to homes 23 located in rural areas in the State, such as Puna and Ka`u, will 24 enable individuals to be eligible for Rural Development section 25 502 loans, and increase the availability and production of 26 affordable housing units in these areas with minimal expenditure 27 of state funds; now, therefore 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 31 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 32 Health is requested to adopt administrative rules to include 33 provisions for the regulation and Department approval of 34 catchment water systems that serve and provide water for daily 35 and household requirements in rural areas; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health is 38 requested to cooperate and coordinate with the State Director of 39 40 the United States Department of Agriculture's Hawaii State Rural Development Office to adopt, amend, and finalize any 41 administrative rules necessary to facilitate the eligibility of 42 catchment water systems for Rural Development section 502 loans; 43 44 and 2007-1234 HCR SMA.doc



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Department of Health is requested to submit written report of its findings and recommendations, any proposed legislation, and the rules that were adopted in response to this Concurrent Resolution, to the Legislature no later than twenty days before the convening of the 2008 regular session; and

10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health
11 and the State Director of the United States Department of
12 Agriculture's Hawaii State Rural Development Office.
