HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO ADOPT POLICIES TO PREVENT THE TRANSFER OF INCARCERATED PARENTS OF MINOR CHILDREN TO CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES ON THE MAINLAND.

WHEREAS, during the 1990s, the number of incarcerated 1 parents in the United States grew by approximately fifty-nine 2 per cent; and 3 4 WHEREAS, currently, there is no means of determining the 5 exact number of incarcerated individuals with minor children in 6 Hawaii as no procedure is in place for collecting such data; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, it is estimated, however, that there are approximately 3,163 parents of 6,665 children in Hawaii's prison 10 system; and 11 12 WHEREAS, approximately half of Hawaii's incarcerated felons 13 are sent to private correctional facilities on the mainland 14 making it difficult for them to maintain contact with their 15 families; and 16 17 WHEREAS, an increased focus needs to be placed on the 18 children of incarcerated parents to maintain a parent-child 19 bond; and 20 21 WHEREAS, studies indicate that the children of incarcerated 22 individuals suffer from a multitude of negative consequences, 23 including possible displacement from their home and separation 24 from their primary or secondary caregiver; and 25 26 WHEREAS, as a result, these children experience strong 27 emotional reactions to the incarceration and disruption in their 28 home life, leading to a significant increase, up to six times 29 more likely, of becoming involved in the criminal justice system 30 themselves; and 31 32



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1	WHEREAS, state policies contribute to the breakdown of the
2	family by failing to facilitate the continued relationship
3	between incarcerated individuals and their children when the
4	relationship is in the best interests of the child; and
5	TURDER devial of ministration is a means of munishment on
6	WHEREAS, denial of visitation is a means of punishment or
7	discipline of the incarcerated individuals, but those who truly
8	suffer are the children; and
9	WHEREAS, the strengthening of family relationships has a
10	positive effect on recidivism as studies have shown it lessens
11 12	the possibility of future incarceration after an inmate's
12	release from a correctional facility; and
13 14	rerease from a correctional factificy, and
14	WHEREAS, studies have also shown that therapeutic
16	involvement with families during incarceration builds better and
17	stronger relationships between the incarcerated parent's
18	children and the incarcerated parent once the parent is
19	released; and
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21	WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety should adopt
22	policies to prevent the transfer of Hawaii's incarcerated
23	parents of minor children to correctional facilities on the
24	mainland; now, therefore,
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26	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
27	Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
28	Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
29	Public Safety is requested to adopt policies to prevent the
30	transfer of Hawaii's incarcerated parents of minor children to
31	correctional facilities on the mainland; and

34	Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Interim Director of
35	Public Safety.
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
