H.C.R. NO. 160

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING CONGRESS TO PASS, AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES TO SIGN, THE CAMERON GULBRANSEN KIDS AND CAR SAFETY ACT.

1	WHEREAS, every other day, a young child is killed in a non-
2	traffic automobile accident, and the age of the victims in these
3	cases is usually less than 4-years old; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, since 1999, at least 1,000 children have died in
6	non-traffic incidents, and these statistics are increasing
7	steadily when, for instance, in 2005 alone there have been at
8	least 222 fatalities; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, a 2002 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
11	(CDC) study revealed that over 9,160 children were treated in
12	hospital emergency rooms due to nontraffic incidents; and
13	
14 15	WHEREAS, the federal government does not currently have any regulations about what a driver should be able to see behind a
15 16	vehicle; and
17	Venicie, and
18	WHEREAS, the United States Congress is considering
19	addressing this issue through the Cameron Gulbransen Kids and
20	Cars Safety Act, a piece of legislation directing the Secretary
21	of Transportation to issue safety standards and take other
22	action to reduce the incidence of child injury and death inside
23	or outside of parked passenger motor vehicles; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, the bill is named after Cameron Gulbransen, a two
26	year old who was accidentally run over and killed by his father
27	as he was backing out his vehicle; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, this tragedy has been repeated many times in
30	Hawaii where recently in Punalu'u, 2-year- old Teysia Aku was
31	fatally injured when a car backed out of her family's driveway,
32	and in Puna where 2-year-old Abygail Arquitola was killed in a
33	hit-and-run accident while playing in the back of a subdivision;

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1 2 WHEREAS, The Cameron Gulbransen Kids and Cars Safety Act will help to lessen and eliminate these tragic incidences by 3 requiring such things as a rearward visibility performance 4 standard that will provide drivers with a means of detecting the 5 presence of a person behind the vehicle, and requiring the 6 7 vehicle service brake to be engaged in all key positions and while the key is out of the ignition, in order to prevent 8 9 incidents resulting from children disengaging the gear shift and causing vehicles to roll away; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the act further promotes child safety by 12 13 establishing a child safety information program that will involve collecting non-traffic incident data, informing parents 14 15 about these hazards to children, and ways to mitigate them, as well as making this information available to the public through 16 the Internet and other means; and 17 18 WHEREAS, this legislation is supported by a large number 19 20 groups including KIDS AND CARS, Consumer Union, Advocates for Highway and Auto Safety, the American Academy of Pediatrics, 21 Public Citizen, Kids in Danger, Trauma Foundation, The Zoie 22 Foundation, Adrianna's Rule Foundation, Veronica's Eye 23 Foundation, Craig's Crusade and more; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 26 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 27 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature 28 urges the Congress of the United States to pass the Cameron 29 30 Gulbransen Kids and Car Safety Act; and 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature urge the 32 33 President of the United States to sign the Cameron Gulbransen Kids and Car Safety Act; and 34 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 37 38 United States, each member of the Hawaii Congressional Delegation, the Speaker of United States House of 39 40 Representatives, and the President pro tempore of the United 41 States Senate. 42 43 44 HCR HMIA 19-2007
